#### **TANZANIA**

February and March on the Serengeti short grass plains are an absolute must-visit for anyone seeking an unforgettable experience. During this calving season, the magnificent spectacle of the Serengeti migration takes centre stage. These plains, enriched with magnesium, were shaped millions of years ago during the eruption of the volcano that has become the Ngorongoro Crater. They provide the perfect sanctuary for young wildebeest, and host the birth of approximately 250,000 calves in just two months. It is undoubtedly one of the most awe-inspiring wildlife events on the planet. The abundance of food in this compact area attracts every predator in the vicinity.

Fascinating fact – did you know that wildebeest calves are born before 10am in the morning, ensuring they have ample time to learn to run before nightfall.

When it comes to planning a Serengeti journey, February and March should be placed firmly at the top of any bucket list.

#### FlyNamibia launches Windhoek – Victoria Falls route

FlyNamibia is to launch a Windhoek to Victoria Falls route, starting on 04 April 2024.

- Flights will operate on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays between Hosea Kutako International Airport and the Zimbabwean resort town of Victoria Falls.
- This new route aims to enhance regional connectivity, promote tourism within Namibia, and position Windhoek as an alternative gateway to the region.



- FlyNamibia currently operates domestic routes from Eros Airport in Windhoek to Ondangwa, Rundu, Katima Mulilo,

  International Airport.
- Through its partnership with Airlink, and access to the \*GDS, FlyNamibia can promote its new flights and packages to markets that were previously beyond reach. The airline also recently became a member of IATA.
