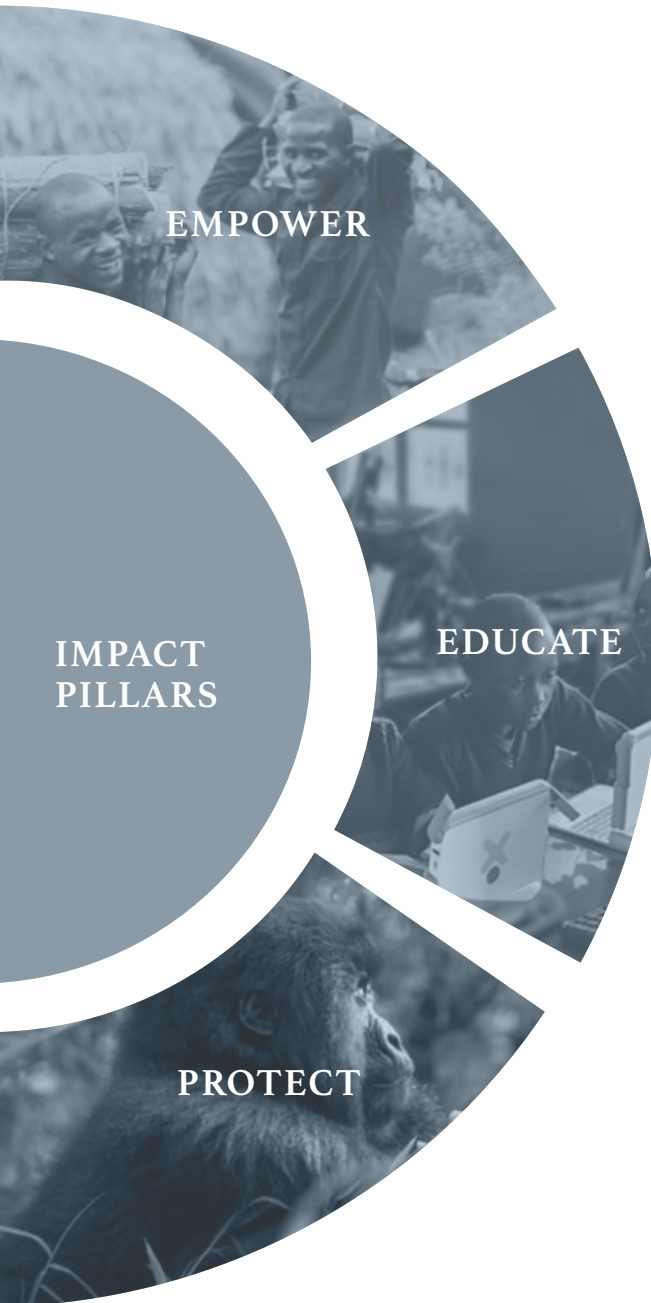

EMPOWER Building conservation economies, providing employment and support to small and local businesses

PROTECT Human-wildlife co-existence and biodiversity stewardship

USD17,5 million paid by Wilderness and guests for leases, permits and park fees
135,000 indigenous trees planted at Bisate, Sabyinyo and Gishwati
USD630,000 invested in land for expansion of gorilla and chimpanzee habitat
USD164,500 invested in chimpanzee research and habituation
