# SPOTLIGHT ON NAMIBIA



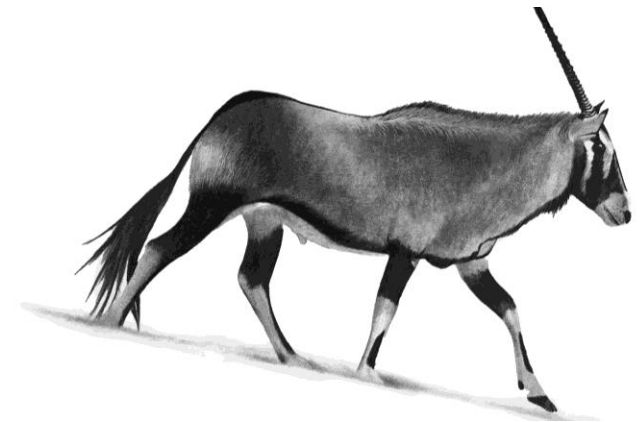

**Place:** A welcome oasis situated on the dry Auab riverbed in the Kulala Wilderness Reserve, Little Kulala celebrates the splendour and solitude of the Namib Desert. Excursions to Sossusvlei (via a gate exclusive to Wilderness vehicles), nature drives, walks and eco-sensitive quad biking, explore this fascinating landscape. A balloon safari (at extra cost) offers an awe-inspiring experience soaring silently above the desert.

**Accommodation:** Inspired by Dead Vlei, the design of the eleven luxury desert suites (10 twins and one family unit) now offers improved airflow to the brick and glass accommodation set under thatch. Each suite features a spacious deck, sala and private plunge pool, merging seamlessly into the timeless desert setting. A private rooftop area offers romantic stargazing, and sleep-outs on the bottom deck of each accommodation complete the experience. Interiors illustrate an extension of the desert's natural beauty, replicated in colour choice, palette, decor and art.

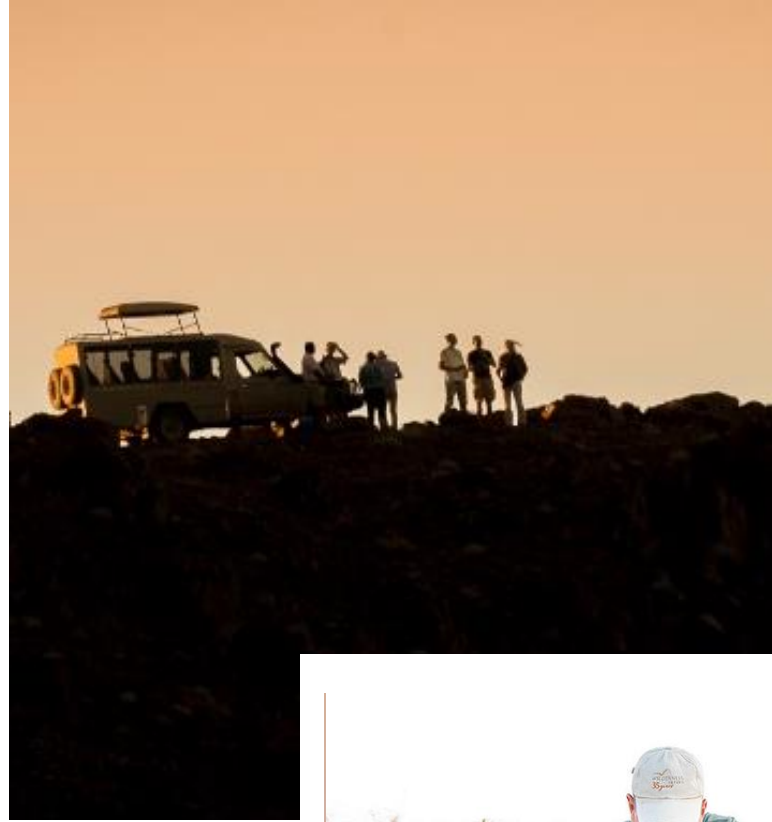


# WHY LITTLE KULALA? CLEMENT SAYS...

- Bordering the Namib-Naukluft National Park and accessible through an exclusive-use gate, our two Kulala Wilderness Reserve camps are the closest to the iconic red dunes of Sossusvlei and Dead Vlei.
- Thrilling hot air balloon flights over the vast Namib Sand Sea are launched from our private reserve.
- Set on 27 000 hectares of pristine private land bordering Sossusvlei, Kulala Wilderness Reserve offers endless spectacular desert scenery and extraordinary, and unexpected, desert wildlife.
- Once farmland used for subsistence goat farming, Kulala Wilderness Reserve had very little indigenous wildlife. In 1996 Wilderness stepped in to rehabilitate the area and today the land and its wildlife have returned to their former glorious natural state.
- Each large climate-controlled suite has a rooftop which can be used for starlit dinners or star gazing, and the spacious sala below has a private plunge pool and an area for outdoor siestas during the day or sleep-outs under the stars.

**Place:** In a wide valley sometimes flush with grass, Desert Rhino Camp lies in the midst of the enormous Palmwag Concession, where trackers patrol and protect one of the largest free-ranging populations of the endangered desert-adapted rhino in Africa. Rhino tracking on foot and by vehicle with these dedicated men is an original and exclusive wilderness experience; others include exploring the area on full-day outings, nature drives and walks.

**Accommodation:** All six tents face the rugged desert landscape, featuring deep overhanging stretch fabric roof structures that offer protection from the desert sun while preserving the exquisite horizon views, within this breathtaking desert landscape. Soft interiors showcase stone, timber and leather, celebrating the classic explorer age, while seamlessly blending in modern style and sophistication.



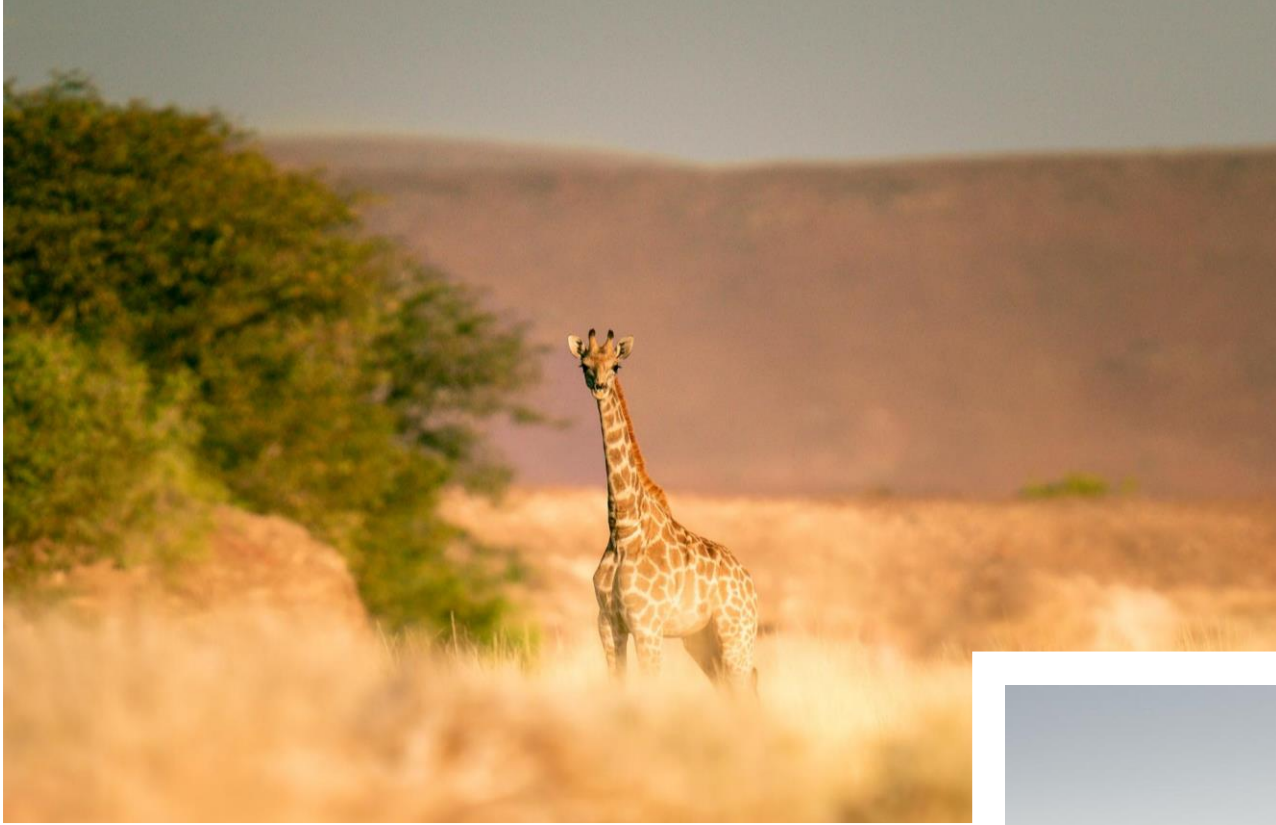
# WHY DESERT RHINO CAMP? CLEMENT SAYS...

- Exclusive opportunity to track on foot Critically Endangered black rhino in Namibia's 583,000-hectare (1,440,624-acre) Palmwag Concession, with monitors from Wilderness' on-site conservation partner, Save the Rhino Trust Namibia.
- The area is home to other large mammals which are occasionally seen, including zebras, spotted hyenas and giraffe, and antelope such as oryx and springbok. Occurring here too, but more rarely spotted, are desert-adapted lions, elephants, and sometimes even leopards.
- Birdlife is prolific and diverse, with most of Namibia's endemics present. Key species include Rüppell's korhaan, Benguela long-billed lark, Herero chat and Verreaux's eagle.
- Newly-rebuilt suites with deep overhanging stretch fabric roof structures, interior tones of terracotta, sage, fern green and cream, and classic details of timber and leather, create a sheltered sanctuary within this breath-taking desert landscape.





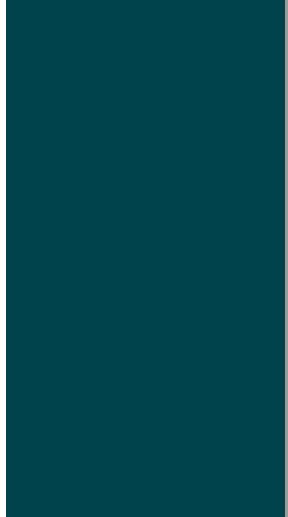












 WILDERNESS DESERT RHINO CAMP – MAIN AREA

**Place:** In a remote area of the Kaokoveld, with gravel-strewn plains and dry riverbeds that draw fascinating wildlife, lies Hoanib Skeleton Coast Camp. Explorations of this isolated yet diverse area take place via game drives along the riverbed's narrow ribbon of vegetation, where a surprising wealth of desert-adapted animals can be found, while the research centre provides further insights. The desolate Skeleton Coast with its shipwreck remains and noisy colonies of Cape fur seals is accessed either by a fascinating drive or flight, depending on the weather.

**Accommodation:** The eight large tents (including one family unit) and the main area and pool look out over rugged scenery: a wide valley that slopes down to the almost-always dry Hoanib River.

# WHY HOANIB SKELETON COAST CAMP? CLEMENT SAYS...

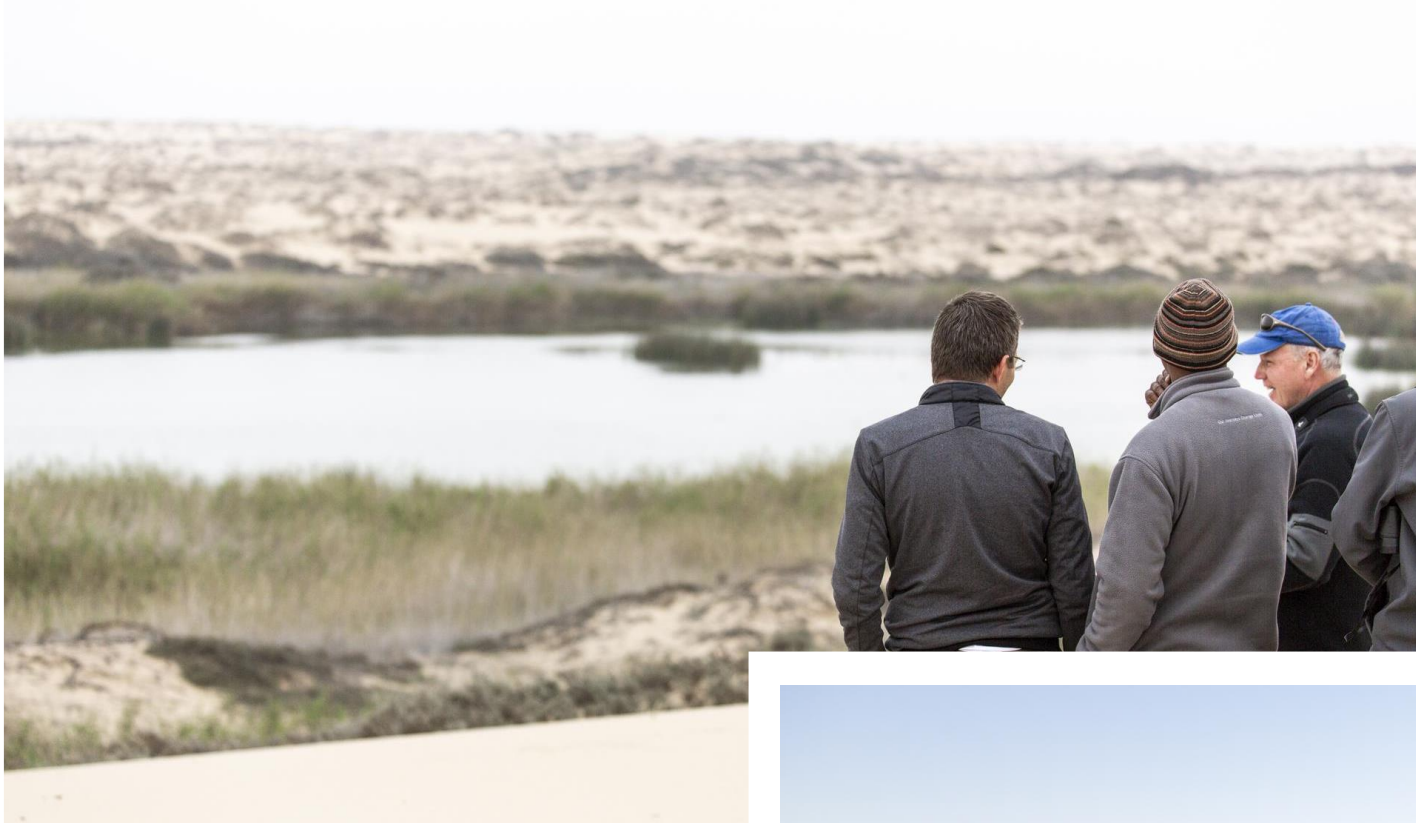
- Hoanib Skeleton Coast Camp offers an unforgettable adventure in a remote and rugged part of Namibia.
- Explore the Skeleton Coast on a day trip through dunes and oases, with a scenic flight back for incredible aerial views.
- Nature drives reveal desert-adapted wildlife, from elephants and lions to the elusive brown hyena, and birdwatchers can spot rare desert species like Rüppell's korhaan, Benguela long-billed lark, and Verreauxs' eagle.
- Unique activities including hiking rocky outcrops, sliding down dunes, and dining under the stars.
- The camp is dedicated to conservation, featuring an in-camp Research Centre and supporting local communities through partnerships with neighbouring conservancies. High-end hospitality meets raw wilderness, with stunning views of wildlife at a nearby waterhole.



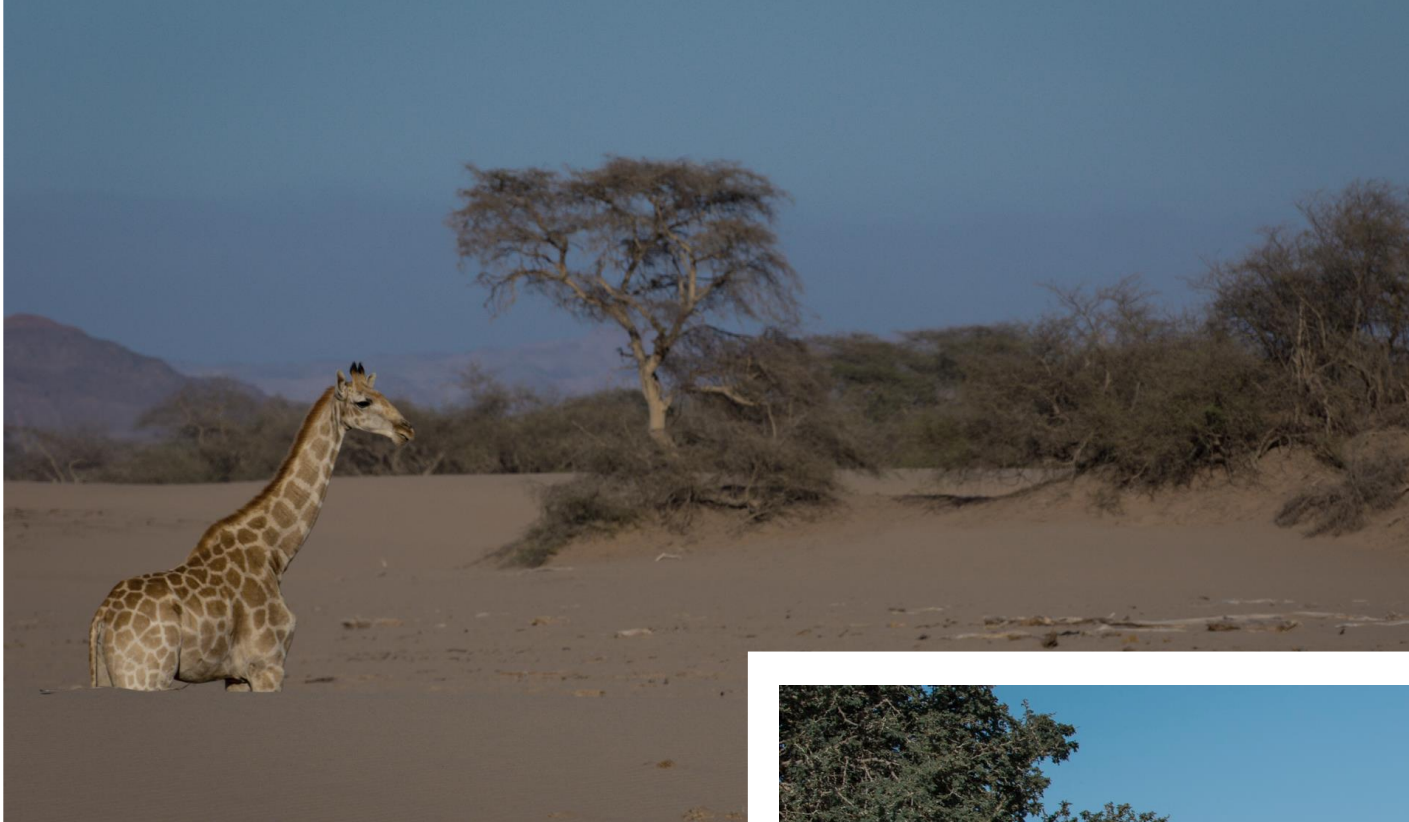
















 WILDERNESS HOANIB SKELETON COAST CAMP – MAIN AREA

**Place:** Set under trees on the banks of the Kunene River, Serra Cafema is one of the most remote camps in southern Africa. Guests can truly disconnect, unwind and relax to the sound of rushing water, and explore one of the driest deserts in the world. Respectful interaction with a nearby Himba community, fascinating nature walks, boating (water levels permitting), and low-impact guided quad-bike excursions complete the experience.

**Accommodation:** The eight chalets (including one family unit) are set on elevated decks and crafted in wood, canvas and thatch to create a unique camp that is at one with its surroundings and celebrates the culture of the Himba people. The Ozonganda (Herero, meaning “main area”) affords spectacular views over the Kunene River.



## WHY SERRA CAFEMA? CLEMENT SAYS...

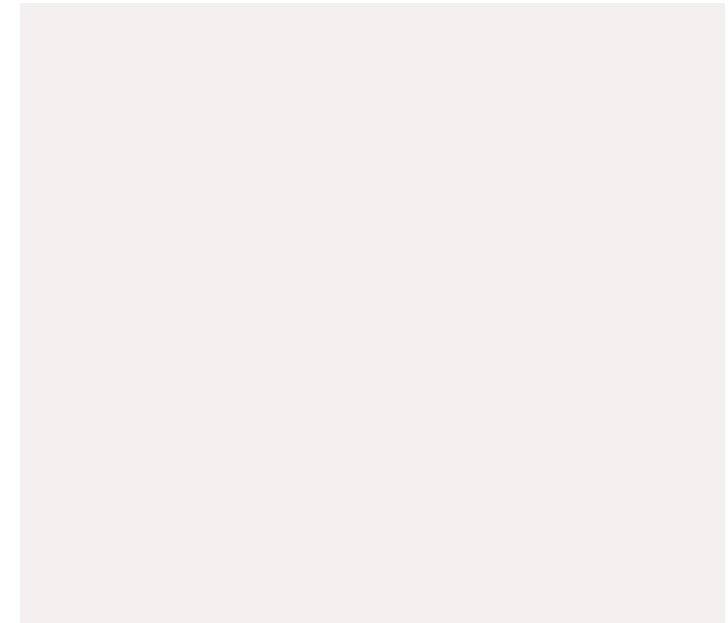
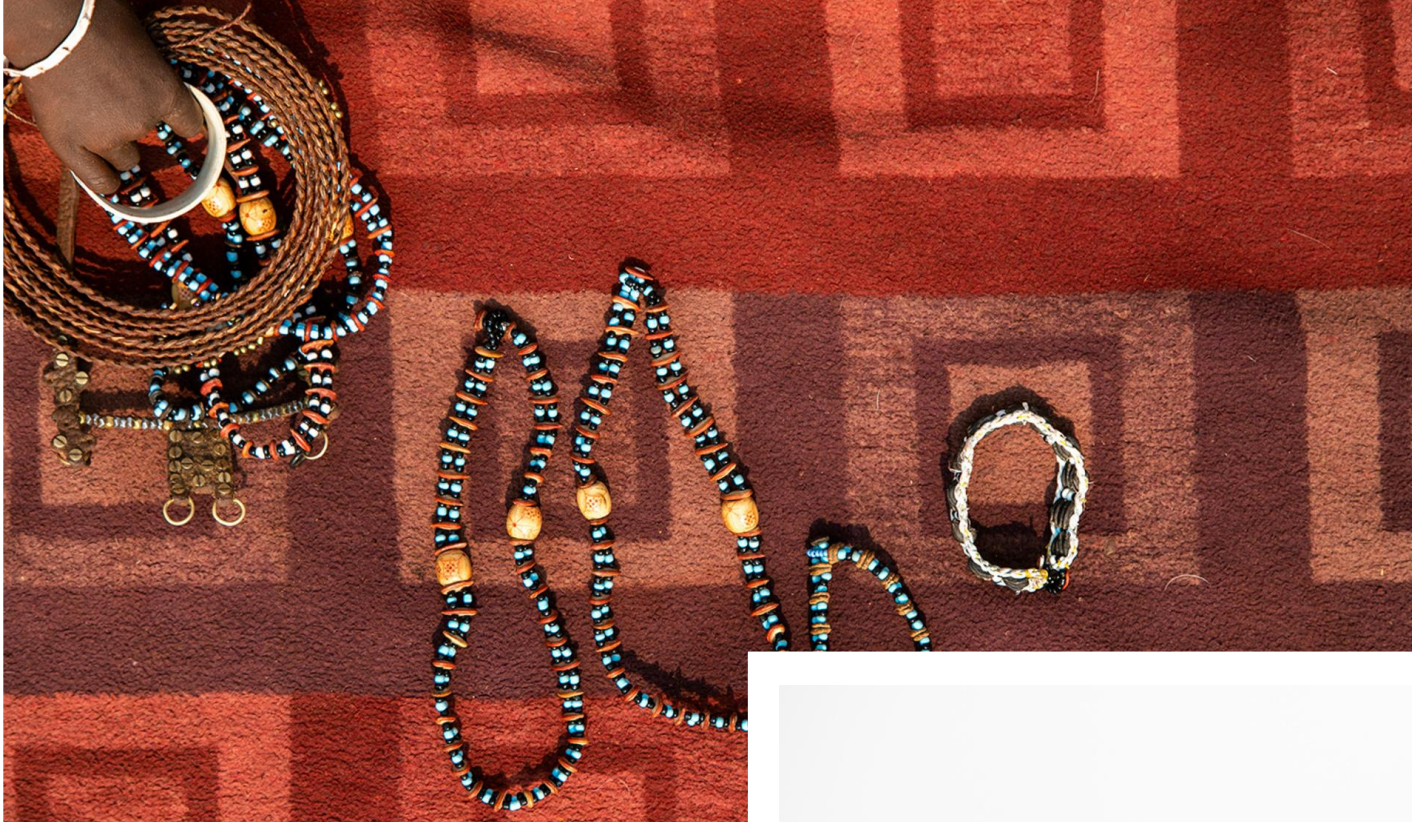
- Serra Cafema sits in a landscape full of stunning contrasts, where lush riverine vegetation along the Kunene River meets the dramatic, rugged expanse of Hartmann's Valley.
- The area teems with an incredible variety of wildlife; desert-adapted oryx, springbok, and Hartmann's mountain zebra, chameleons and crocodiles, plus a host of vibrant bird species.
- One of the most special aspects of staying at Serra Cafema is the opportunity to engage meaningfully and respectfully with the local Himba community, allowing you to learn about and support their traditional, semi-nomadic way of life.
- The experiences here are as diverse as the landscape itself. From dune-friendly quad biking adventures, to nature walks through fascinating geological formations, and, when the season allows, serene boating excursions on the Kunene River.
- Serra Cafema is designed for relaxation and a true sense of disconnection, with eight beautifully appointed canvas suites (including a family unit) set on elevated decks that immerse guests in the natural surroundings.







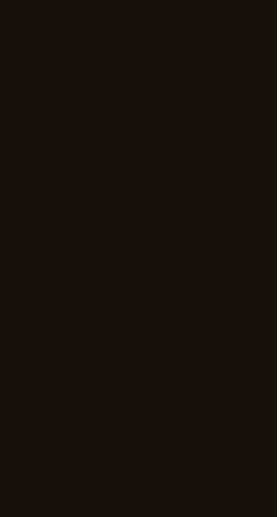
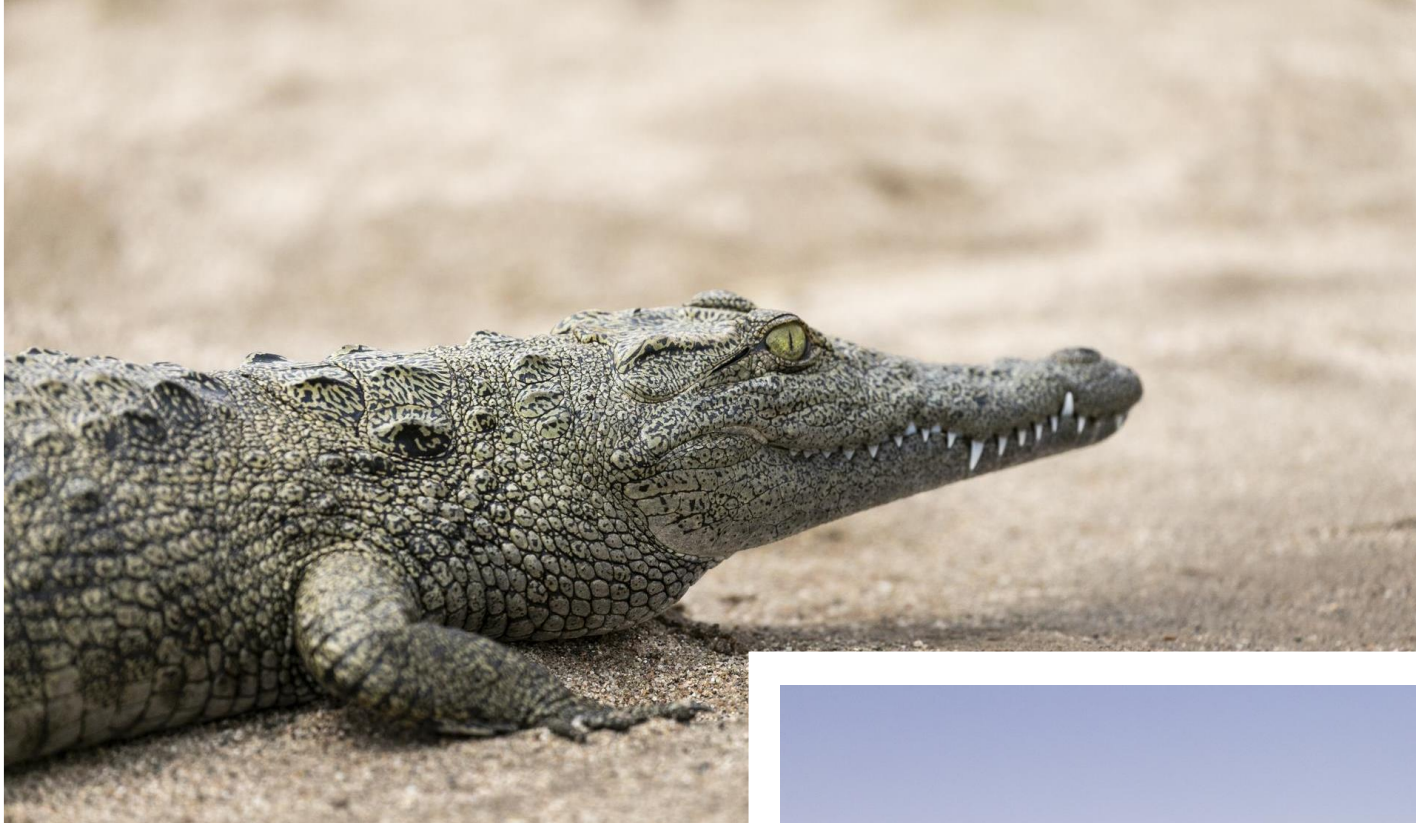




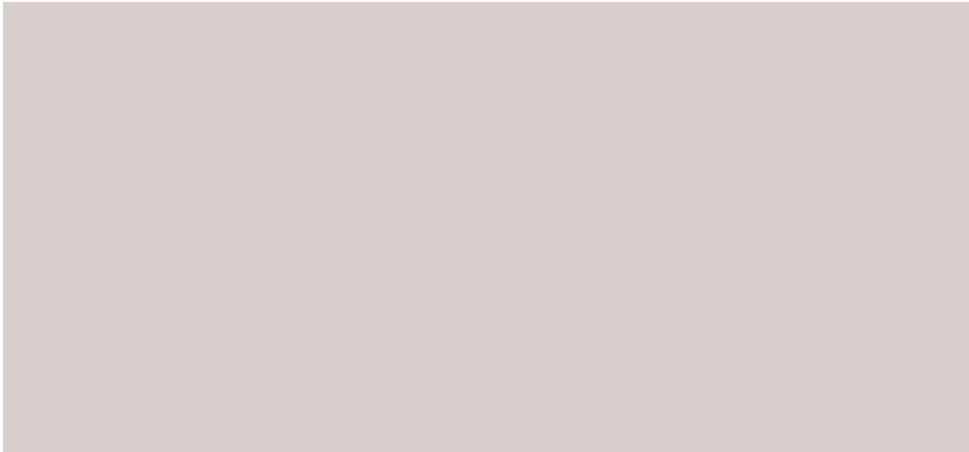












WILDERNESS SERRA CAFEMA – MAIN AREA
