### **SOUTH AFRICA**

Destination:	&Beyond Phinda Game Reserve, Kwa-Zulu Natal
Suits which type of traveller:	The six lodge options at Phinda cater to mid-range, high-end leisure travellers, and family-friendly budgets.
Recommended activities:	We were surprised and spoilt to experience an activity called <b>Beyond the Senses</b> . We went for a night game drive with a vehicle fitted with high-definition thermal imaging and infrared cameras and we had wireless headsets. We saw a lion, hippos and porcupine — a nice experience to see animals at night and I would highly recommend this activity. It can only be booked at the lodge directly.
	<b>E-biking excursion</b> – with rangers leading from the front and the back. We had a cyclist from the local community accompanying us, and the activity was fun and amazing, as were riding through sand forest trees; it took roughly an hour. I would recommend this activity for those who are fit, or comfortable on a bicycle.
	<b>Game drives</b> – Phinda's vehicles are 6-seaters, where everyone gets a window seat. The landscape is different in the north of the reserve, with sand forest trees, while other parts of the reserve are flat and sandy. During the drive we saw lion, cheetahs, white rhinos, giraffe, nyala, herds of elephants, wildebeest and zebras.
	Our guide was good, and knowledgeable about the animals and the areas we were driving in. We stopped for a sundowner drink with snacks, gin and wine.
Cuisine:	The food was delicious with various options to choose from. You order from the menu, and they cater for different dietary requirements including gluten free and lactose intolerance. There was also an option to have prawns as a starter, which was good to see
	Breakfast, which is normally served from 9am, has options of a continental breakfast or a la carte.
	For lunch, served at 1pm, you order from the menu which also catered for different dietary requirements. Lunch was delicious, served on the deck of the main area.
Highlights during visit/stay:	The reserve is 73,800 acres / 29,866 hectares in size, with 30% of the world's remaining sand forest located on the reserve in South Africa. It is home to one of the world smallest blooming orchids, while seven distinct habitats make the wildlife & activity experiences unique & different to any other traditional safari experience.
	&Beyond Phinda Mountain Lodge is a beautiful property located in the south of the reserve facing a mountain. We stayed at Phinda Mountain Lodge for two nights.



The main area of the lodge has a lounge area with the views of the mountain, as well as a safari shop, a boma, swimming pool and gym.

I stayed in a spacious suite with an en-suite bathroom and indoor and outdoor showers, mini-bar and tea/coffee station, air-conditioning, a safe, and a plunge pool with a veranda.

Phinda Forest Lodge is looking beautiful after going through a refurb, and the amenities of the lodge (pool, gym, firepit, boma and safari shop) are spread out over a short walking distance.

The rooms are in the sand forest canopy and the rooms are spacious, with floor to ceiling windows offering views of the forest from your bath; they also have an indoor shower, mini-bar, tea/coffee station, air-condition, a safe and a private deck.

The highlight of the trip was the incredible staff at both Phinda Forest and Mountain lodges, the amazing sightings we had during the game drives with experienced rangers and trackers, and of course the lovely meals from breakfast to bush dinners, experiencing the e-bike activity through the sand forest, as well as the Beyond the Senses activity. Both lodges are looking great.
