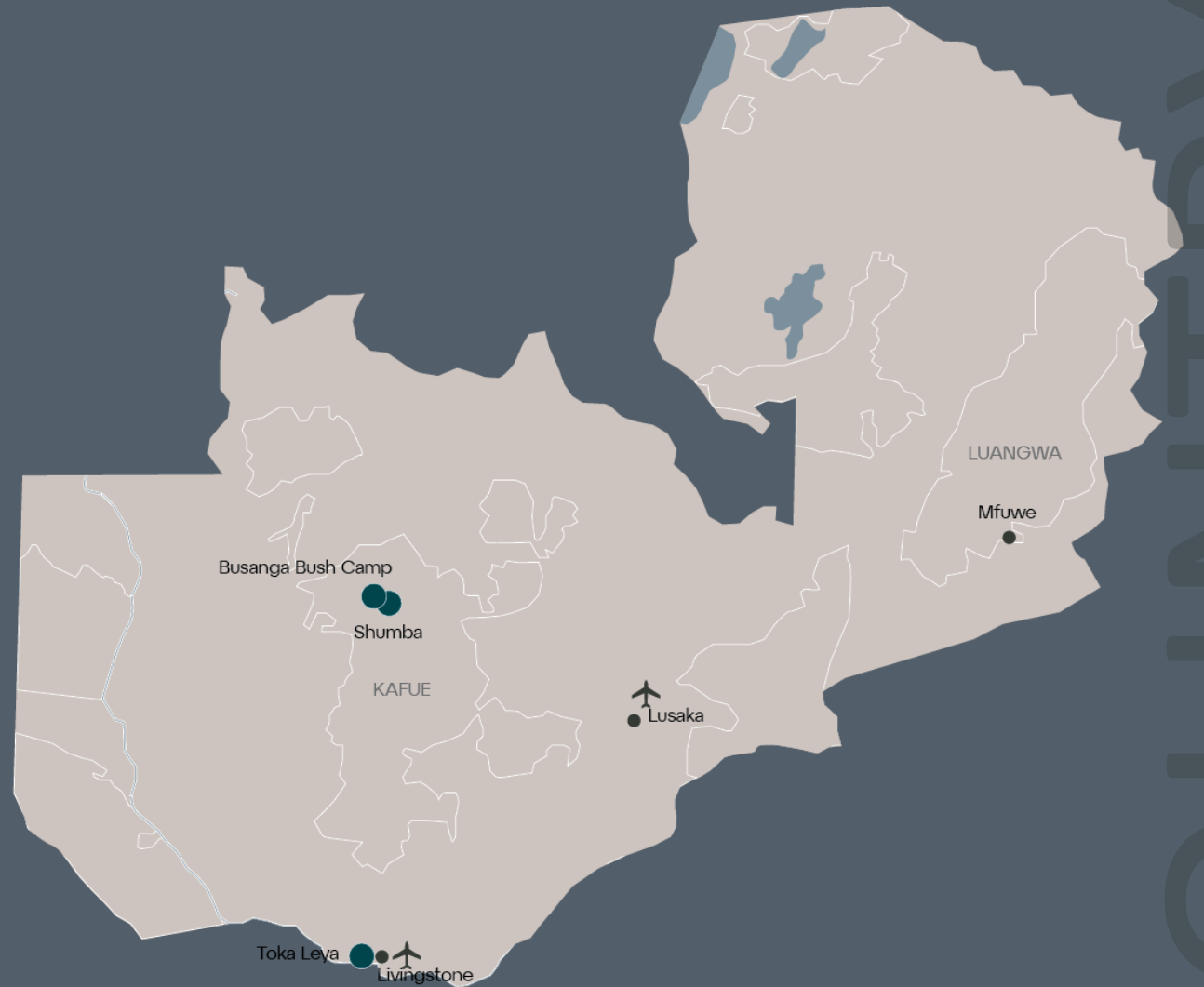

ZAMBIA

- A land of wonder hewn by the Great Rift Valley. Dramatic landscapes include the Luangwa Valley, the breath-taking Victoria Falls and Lake Tanganyika (the second deepest natural lake in the world), the Kafue floodplains, Barotseland and the Bangweulu Swamps.
- A massive country with a remarkably low population, Zambia's game areas are some of the most remote and untouched in Africa. Safaris in the national parks offer a sense of true exclusivity, with walking safaris being particularly famous here.
- An important refuge for vulnerable and rare species, Zambia's national parks offer big game safaris. Its biodiversity count includes 740 bird, over 200 mammal, 143 reptile and 57 amphibian species.

UNIQUE SELLING POINTS

Kafue National Park

- To the north, seasonal floodplains and far-reaching, wildlife-rich wetlands dominate the area – including the Busanga Plains, the jewel of the Kafue National Park and an important Ramsar-recognised wetland system. The further south you travel, the dryer it becomes.
- The Lunga, Lufupa and Kafue rivers – the major water courses that feed and drain the Park – are lined with riverine forest, and the landscape is further patterned with broad-leaved miombo woodland, floodplains and island thickets. All these provide exceptional biodiversity, as well as great diversity of activities, from boating, birding and walking safaris to classic game drives.

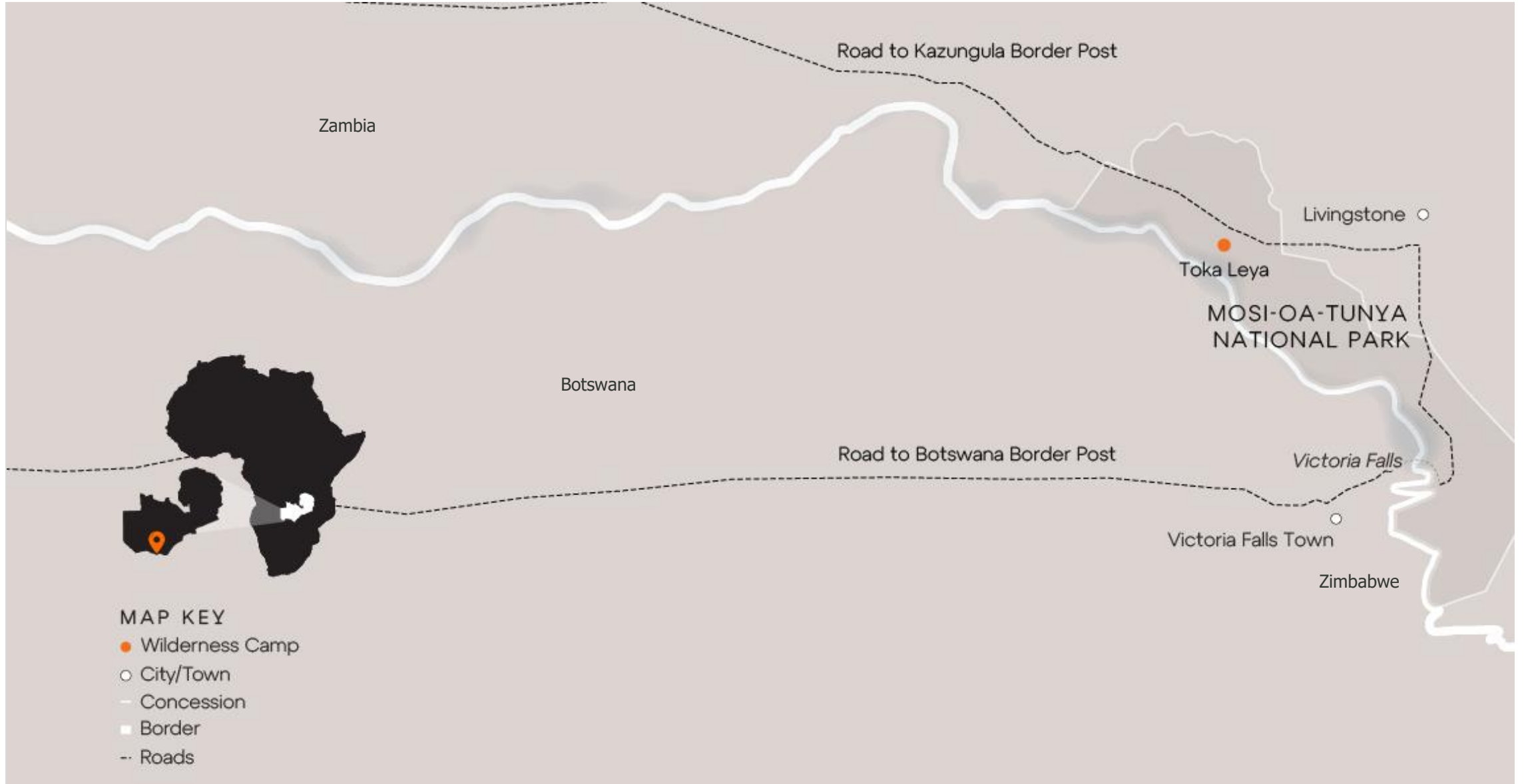

UNIQUE SELLING POINTS

Mosi-oa-Tunya

- Listed as one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Victoria Falls is almost 2 kilometres wide, and plunges dramatically more than 100 metres into the Batoka Gorge, raising an iridescent mist that can be seen from as far as 20 km away. Hence its local name 'Mosi-oa-Tunya' – The Smoke that Thunders.
- An area of outstanding beauty, Livingstone offers the adrenaline junkie a wealth of blood-thumping experiences – from the Victoria Falls' Devil's Pool and bridge-swinging, to bungee jumping, white-water rafting and much more.
