

Zimbabwe

- Zimbabwe offers a contrast of magnificent natural landscapes, with two of Africa's most impressive rivers the Limpopo and Zambezi flanking its borders. Between them, sultry savannah gives way to the fascinating rock formations of the Matobo Hills, as well as the extraordinary, man-made Lake Kariba. The Eastern Highlands, running alongside the Mozambican border for some 300 kilometres, is a spectacular mountainous habitat.
- Zimbabwe offers year-round, value-for-money, classic Southern
 African safari experiences. Iconic national parks conserve an
 abundance of big and small wildlife, including the vast savannah of
 Hwange and the riverine bounty of UNESCO World Heritage site of
 Mana Pools amongst others.










Hwange National Park

- Hwange National Park is Zimbabwe's oldest and largest protected park. The size of Belgium, the massive park covers some 1.4 million hectares (3.46 million acres) and includes a mix of savannah habitats, including broadleaf woodlands, acacia scrub, grasslands and salt pans.
- High densities of wildlife proliferate within the diverse habitats.
- Supporting all the iconic safari mammals, Hwange is particularly known for its impressive concentrations of elephants and buffalos, and harbours one of Africa's largest populations of wild dogs.
- The diversity of habitats means that the park supports large numbers of both desertadapted and woodland wildlife, including special rarities such as roan, sable, oryx, brown hyaena, Selous mongoose and bat-eared fox.
- Birdlife is varied and prolific, with over 400 species recorded in the park.




