Destination:	Wilderness Ruckomechi, with a site visit to Little Ruckomechi
Participants:	Leigh Williams, Xoliswa Tlhale, Jo-Ann Larkan, Emily Rooi
Suits which type of traveller:	All travellers. 2 x family rooms situated close to the main area.
Recommended activities:	 Game drive. The sightings were sensational. Afternoon boat cruise. The boat activity provides a refreshing escape, particularly on sweltering hot days. Sleepout. The sleepout is primarily suited for 2 guests, though arrangements for 4 guests can be made on a case-by-case basis.
Cuisine:	Buffet style. The food was tasty, and all dietary needs were fully catered to.
Highlights during visit/stay:	 Lounge at the airstrip. Game drives. We were extremely fortunate to have witnessed 3 lion kills. Our guide, Causemore, was incredibly knowledgeable, humorous, and attentive to the varying personalities of everyone on the vehicle. Elephants drinking from the swimming pool we were sitting in.



- Surprise private bush brunch. Causemore received a message over the radio and
 promptly announced that there was a leopard on a kill not far from camp and that we
 need to get there quickly. We raced off, all full of excitement, only to arrive at an
 incredibly laid-out bush brunch on the river. The food was delicious.
- The camp managers kindly arranged that all 4 of us could do the sleep-out on our second night. The sleep-out is positioned right next to a small waterhole, so we slept to the chorus of frogs. We awoke the next morning to news from the guide that a leopard came to drink water during the night.





Destination:	Wilderness Little Makalolo, with site visits to Wilderness Davison's and Wilderness Linkwasha
Participants:	Leigh Williams, Xoliswa Tlhale, Jo-Ann Larkan, Emily Rooi
Suits which type of traveller:	 Little Makalolo - All travellers Davison's - All travellers. Quite rustic. Linkwasha - All travellers. Could be easily included on a Premier itinerary.
Recommended activities:	 Little Makalolo – Log pile hide in front of camp. Linkwasha – Sunken hide in front of camp. The hide is fully equipped with a minibar, tea and coffee facilities, and comfortable seating.
Cuisine:	 Little Makalolo – Plated meals. Linkwasha – Family style lunch was served. The food was colourful and tasty.
Highlights during visit/stay:	 Little Makalolo – We were welcomed by a pride of 14 lions feeding on a baby elephant right next to the waterhole in front of camp. In the morning, the chef made delicious jaffles over the fire before we headed out on our morning activity. Davison's – Bar deck above the main deck area. Great views.
