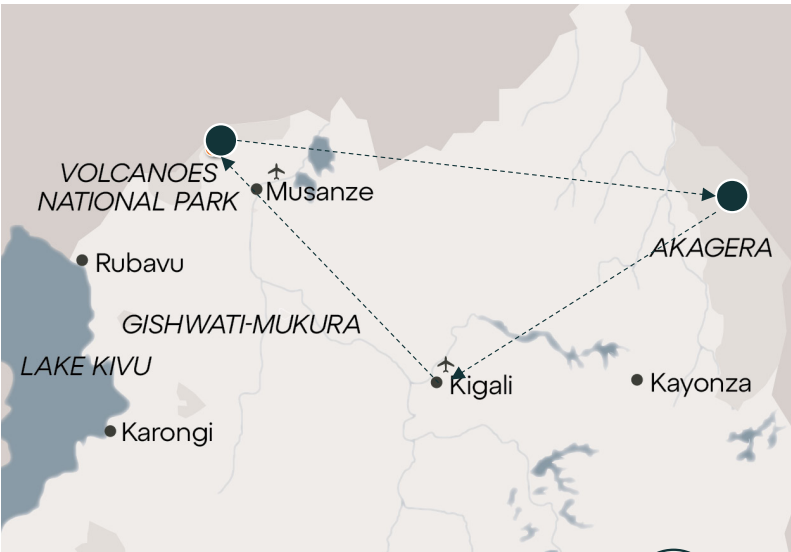

Place: The Mara Triangle offers one of the most exclusive and rewarding safari experiences in the greater Masai Mara. Managed by the Mara Conservancy, this region is renowned for its innovative conservation model: a successful public-private partnership that ensures well-maintained roads, effective anti-poaching patrols, and sustainable tourism practices. With fewer lodges and vehicles, sightings feel exclusive and unhurried, especially during the Great Migration's dramatic river crossings. The landscape is a stunning mix of open plains, riverine forest, and seasonal marsh, alive with big cats, elephants, black rhino, and prolific birdlife.

Accommodation: Wilderness Mara offers twelve spacious canvas tents, positioned to maximise privacy and views. Elevated private decks (a metre to a metre and a half off the ground) offer views over the marsh, drawing wildlife and birds. Each tent includes an indoor and outdoor shower. While no family units are available, the layout allows for a peaceful retreat ideal for couples or solo travellers.

WHY WILDERNESS MARA?

- Wilderness Mara is the only camp in the Mara Triangle that gives guests access to both sides of the Mara River – unlocking more space, more wildlife, and fewer crowds.
- Situated in the Mara Triangle, one of Africa's most exclusive safari regions, the camp offers front-row access to the Great Migration's dramatic river crossings.
- With fewer lodges and vehicles in this conservancy, sightings feel unhurried and authentic – whether of black rhino, big cats, elephants, or prolific birdlife.
- A complete rebuild has created just 12 tented suites, blending classic East African safari style with modern comforts, including a spa, gym, and photographic studio.
- Conservation impact extends beyond the Triangle, with support for predator monitoring, pangolin protection, raptor conservation, and Children in the Wilderness programmes.

Place: On the edge of Volcanoes National Park, Wilderness Bisate Reserve offers sweeping views of six dormant volcanoes, including Bisoke and Karisimbi. Just a short walk from iconic Wilderness Bisate, yet entirely secluded, Bisate Reserve delivers a rare, elevated rainforest experience. Set at altitude and immersed in nature, it's designed for the most discerning connoisseurs of conservation and mountain gorilla encounters.

Accommodation: Wilderness Bisate Reserve boasts four generous 212 square metre villas, sleeping just eight guests. With two fireplaces in each villa, outdoor hot tubs on the decks, a separate lounge for in-room dining, and plenty of space for dressing, relaxing and even a private massage, they represent the pinnacle of luxury. Villas 1, 2 and 3 are easily accessible and just one level down from the main area, while Villa 4 is positioned further away, and is ideal for honeymooners, or guests who want exceptional privacy. Villas 1 and 2 can also be interlinked via a corridor for families travelling together.

WHY BISATE RESERVE?

- For discerning travellers, Wilderness Bisate Reserve offers the most exclusive base for gorilla trekking, with just four villas ensuring absolute privacy and personalised service.
- The villas themselves are a highlight – generous in scale, elegantly designed, each with a private hot tub overlooking the Virunga volcanoes.
- Pre- and post-trek logistics are seamless, with a dedicated gear-prep room and access to the Bisate Kwanda Day Lounge for early arrivals and late departures.
- Its elevated setting above iconic Bisate provides both premier access to Volcanoes National Park and complete seclusion – a rare combination.
- The lodge's purpose-driven ethos means every guest experience contributes to pioneering conservation and reforestation work, adding depth to the luxury.

Accommodation: Wilderness Magashi Peninsula is an exclusive, eight-bed camp situated in Akagera National Park, Rwanda. With a focus on privacy, luxury, and conservation, it promises an exceptional and diverse safari experience. In a class of its own, the camp combines Rwandan-inspired design with contemporary luxury. Elevated for sweeping views, accommodations include 2 spacious twin suites and a sole-use 4-bed private Villa. Positioned 200-metres apart, these suites offer an exclusive, peaceful retreat. All rooms feature Star Beds, perfect for stargazing or sleeping under the stars with unobstructed views of the surrounding area. The camp and position of the rooms have excellent viewing opportunities of the resident wildlife, including hippos and crocodiles in the lake, and buffalo, elephant and general wildlife moving freely on the Magashi Peninsula.
