





Lion prides in Hwange National Park are powerful and adaptable, navigating a dynamic landscape of open plains and dense bush.





In Hwange, lions rule the open plains while elusive leopards stalk the woodlands — two apex predators, each mastering their own terrain in Zimbabwe's largest National park. Occasionally they meet, and lions have the upper hand.
