The abnormally large numbers of species beneath the waves has measurest have snorkeled with sizeable groups of golden rays, marine turtles, and even reef to mention the characteristically playful sea lions found throughout the archipelago.



In addition to finding larger groups of wildlife, species were also spotted in places where aren't seen, leading to several unexpected, thrilling encounters. Multiple guests comme fact that they had never seen so much marine life on any previous snorkeling and diving to other locations around the world, making their trip with Golden Galapagos Cruises their be ever!

Bursting with Life on Land

Our guides and guests haven't only witnessed more wildlife underwater – there are signific numbers of birds and reptiles on the islands, too. On our guided walks across the Galapa worldly landscapes, guests and visitors have noticed significantly more nests than usual amazing up-close encounters with different bird species at different stages of life – baby niles, and nesting parents, none of which are bothered by our presence. This makes our varieties of some of the Galapagos' endemic species.
