

OUR DESTINATIONS



NAMIBIA

Namibia's rich history and immense and breath-taking desert landscapes, carved out by millennia of geological events, make the country an extraordinary place of discovery and adventure, and a home to incredible endemic and desert-adapted wildlife.



- Wander through the ancient Namib Desert, climb the world's highest dunes and discover the geological marvels of Dead Vlei and Sesriem Canyon.
- Track the world's largest free-roaming black rhino population.
- Explore the dramatic and intriguing Skeleton Coast, home to one of the largest breeding colonies of Cape fur seals.
- Study the southern hemisphere constellations under the canopy of Earth's most extraordinary night skies in the NamibRand's International Dark Sky Reserve.
- Meet some of the oldest cultures on Earth: from the Bantu-speaking Ovambo and Herero to the desert-dwelling Damara minorities and semi-nomadic Himba.
- Explore world-famous Etosha National Park and its unique and vast salt pan, as well as its abundant waterholes teeming with Africa's iconic – and some of the rarest – wildlife species.



BOTSWANA

At the southernmost end of the Great Rift Valley, large rivers flow directly into the Kalahari Desert, creating one the planet's most extraordinary natural phenomena: the Okavango Delta. And with 42% of the country protected under conservation, its high-value, low-volume tourism approach equals unsurpassed privacy and exclusivity.



- Explore the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Okavango Delta and its teeming plains bristling with game and ferocious predators – lion, leopard, cheetah, wild dog, hyena – amongst many others.
- Revere the countless elephants following their migratory patterns across the northern borders of the KAZA region (Linyanti and Chobe).
- Capture once-in-a-lifetime moments with unique wildlife in the remote Central Kalahari Game Reserve and its iconic Deception Valley.
- Discover the World Heritage Site of Tsodilo Hills and its spectacular outdoor gallery of over 4 000 San Bushman rock paintings.




SOUTH AFRICA

As the third most biologically diverse country on Earth, South Africa has a striking assortment of contrasting landscapes, wildlife, cultures and history. Its sensory spectacles range from the particularly gorgeous Mother City – Cape Town – in the south-west, across to the iconic Kruger National Park in the north-east.



- Immerse yourself in the cultural melting pot of the Rainbow Nation and discover its rich and challenging history – from Robben Island to Soweto, and numerous historical battlefields.
- Delight in the juxtaposition of convivial, sophisticated and arty Cape Town, and the exceptional natural beauty of Table Mountain and the Cape Peninsula.
- Savour your way through the scenic winelands, and their award-winning wines and culinary experiences.
- Be surrounded by the legendary bushveld and wildlife of the immense and diverse Greater Kruger National Park and associated private reserves.
- From the icy Atlantic to the subtropical Indian Ocean, surf, snorkel, dive, watch whales and sunbathe on the pristine sands of South Africa's countless beautiful beaches.



RWANDA

Rwanda's complete circuit takes you from the dense rainforest and great apes in the west to the impressive bird- and wildlife of the vast savannah and wetlands in the east.



- Explore Volcanoes National Park and Dian Fossey's beloved mountain gorillas of the Virunga Massif.
- Discover chimpanzees, golden monkeys and other primates and endemics of Nyungwe and Gishwati forests along the biodiversity hotspot of the Albertine Rift.
- Reflect on this miracle country at the evocative Genocide Memorial – a monument to peace and reconciliation.
- Look for tree-climbing lions and other large mammals in spectacularly scenic Akagera National Park.
- Discover Lake Kivu, one of a string of enormous freshwater lakes, known as Africa's Great Lakes, of the African Rift Valley.




KENYA

Synonymous with the greatest migration on the planet, Kenya is where the word safari originated, and where horizon-wide herds roam beneath dominating volcanoes and amongst great lakes and rivers.



- Discover the Masai Mara-Serengeti ecosystem and the world's greatest large mammal migration: more than one million wildebeest.
- Appreciate the colourful cultures and contrasting wildlife experiences in the country's protected areas: Laikipia, Amboseli, Tsavo, the Aberdares and Samburu.
- Experience the millions of flamingos that gather on Lake Nakuru, one of the series of Great Rift Valley lakes.
- Plunge into turquoise ocean water and explore the vibrant coral reefs of Kenya's tropical coastline and isolated islands.




TANZANIA

A country that has it all: bush, beach, cultural diversity, the highest mountain in Africa – Kilimanjaro – and the endless Serengeti plains teeming with wildlife.



- View the great wildebeest migration, and all the drama that surrounds the massive hordes of mammals as they follow the rains.
- Climb Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest mountain in Africa, and a powerful life force (soil and spring water) for the local people.
- Discover the countless and diverse wildlife reserves – from Lake Manyara and Tarangire in the north to Ruaha, Nyerere and Katavi in the south.
- Venture through the enigmatic and game-rich Ngorongoro Crater – a World Heritage Site and the world's largest unfilled volcanic caldera.
- Relax on the tropical ocean islands of Zanzibar or Mafia, and venture out to discover the amazing sea-life amongst the colourful coral reefs.




ZAMBIA

Africa on a grand scale: dramatic landscapes etched by the Great Rift Valley, the teeming plains and wetlands of its remote national parks, the legendary Zambezi River and its astounding Victoria Falls.



- Lock eyes with the famous lion prides of the vast and untamed Busanga Plains in Kafue National Park, drawn to the area for its amazing density of varied antelope species.
- Explore the world-renowned South Luangwa National Park and languid Luangwa River – and concentrations of game attracted to it.
- Experience a diversity of activities on a scenic and thrilling safari in the Lower Zambezi National Park.
- Discover the largely unknown, truly phenomenal fruit bat migration in Kasanka between October and December.
- Swing, bungee, and dive alongside the natural wonder of Victoria Falls.




ZIMBABWE

Classic safari country, Zimbabwe's magnificent natural landscape, filled with wildlife, is flanked by two of Africa's most impressive rivers: the Limpopo and Zambezi.



- Discover the spectacular Victoria Falls – a World Heritage Site and Natural Wonder of the World – and all the adrenaline adventures nearby.
- Be surrounded by herds of elephants in the storied wildlife destination that is Hwange National Park.
- Walk or drive in the towering riverine forest, or discover the wonders of the river by canoe or boat. The unique Zambezi floodplains of the wildlife-rich and exquisite Mana Pools National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, are an endless wild delight.
- Climb the fascinating rock formations of the Matobo Hills and discover one of the highest concentrations of varied eagle species anywhere in world.
- Cruise the phenomenal Lake Kariba and hike in the cool and beautiful Eastern Highlands.
