King's Pool

- King's Pool is known for its quintessential Linyanti game drives both day and night--time, thrilling bush walks and unique helicopter flips here at the tail end of the Great Rift Valley; and equally sublime sunset boating on the Queen Silvia barge.
- However, King's Pool's one-of-a-kind eye-level waterhole at the underground hide sets it apart. Seeing elephant feet and trunks almost within touching distance is an experience that transcends an ordinary safari.
- One of the best places in Botswana to see rare sable and roan.
- The camp's position, alongside Chobe National Park and straddling four unfenced country borders, presents an unobstructed pathway for all manner of wildlife to come and go – particularly wild dogs and elephants.
- As an Important Bird Area (IBA), it is a birder's paradise; a carmine bee-eater nesting site nearby is a spectacle to behold in the summer months.



Access to King's Pool


- Airstrip name: Linyanti Airstrip

The location of King's Pool, bordering Chobe National Park and at the crux of KAZA's important wildlife corridor straddling Angola, Namibia, Zambia and Botswana, means it fulfils a vital role in the area's biodiversity conservation.
