


OVERBERG & GARDEN ROUTE

This extraordinary stretch of coastline includes the towns of Mossel Bay, George, Wilderness, Sedgefield, Knysna, Plettenberg Bay, and Storms River, as well as numerous nature and marine reserves such as the Tsitsikamma and Garden Route national parks. It's a nature lover's paradise with its ecologically diverse flora sustaining a wide range of land animals and marine life. Much of the forest biome, the smallest in South Africa, is found within this region; as a result, many endemic forest species are only found here.

3 OKAVANGO DELTA



THE LINYANTI & SURROUNDS

The Linyanti lies north-east of the Okavango Delta, along the Linyanti fault line. Its varied woodland habitats and ancient floodplains help create a balanced wildlife experience, making it an essential complement to any Okavango visit. The area has several unique features including the Savuti Channel, an ancient and sporadic watercourse attracting abundant wildlife, and the productive Linyanti River frontage. Seasonal zebra and elephant migrations add further drama, and the expanse is the favoured hunting ground for a healthy number of predators such as lion, leopard, hyena, and African wild dog. 

5 CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

Located in the country's north-east, Chobe National Park is famous for enormous herds of elephant and buffalo that come to drink along the banks of the Chobe River. The Park is home to some of the largest herds of elephants in the world, with an estimated population of 120,000. It's also the most accessible park in Botswana, as it's possible to travel overland from the Livingstone-Victoria Falls area. As the dry season approaches, the wildlife concentrates near the river area, which is flat, open terrain, making for excellent viewing. Cruises can also be taken on the river, offering a fascinating perspective to wildlife viewing and photographic opportunities. As this is a large national park, there is quite a lot of traffic, so choosing the correct location is vital to minimise how many other tourists you will see.



6 CENTRAL KALAHARI GAME RESERVE

The Kalahari Desert is the greatest unbroken stretch of sand in the world, and in Botswana, at its core is the Central Kalahari Game Reserve, a vast flat expanse of scrub-covered fossil dunes interspersed with ancient river valleys and acacia savannah areas. At five million hectares (12 million acres), the Central Kalahari Game Reserve is one of the largest protected areas in Africa. Its diverse wildlife – which includes significant populations of lion, cheetah, and brown hyena as well as other desert-adapted wildlife – and incredible scenery offer an amazing contrast to the rest of Botswana. One of its highlights is Deception Valley; located in the north and formed by four fossilised river systems, its sweet grasses attract large herds of herbivores and, in turn, hungry predators.

7 MAKGADIKGADI

The vast salt pans and grass plains of Makgadikgadi form part of the Central Kalahari and remain almost entirely devoid of wildlife for most of the year. When the rains fall, however, it triggers the zebra migration – Africa's other great migration – which moves between the Okavango Delta and Makgadikgadi. Many are also drawn here by the epic emptiness, a vast plain of salt punctuated by solitary islands of rocks and baobabs. The San people still live in this area and have fascinating techniques for surviving these harsh climes. Indeed, they have lived here for millennia, and it's possible to find evidence of their distant ancestors through archaeological





6 LAIKIPIA COUNTY





FISH RIVER CANYON

5 SOSSUSVLEI

Sossusvlei's towering sand dunes and clay pans form one of Namibia's most iconic landscapes. Located in the vast Namib-Naukluft National Park, this rippling sand sea of towering dunes has been shaped by the wind, and the underground Tsauchab River. While seemingly barren due to its status as one of the oldest and driest ecosystems, the clay 'vleis' (pans or valleys) feature a mosaic pattern where green camelthorn trees grow, and oryx and ostrich can be seen. Solitary dead acacia trees mark the river's old routes, some centuries old. During the rainy season (January to April), the pans bloom with yellow devil thorn flowers, and the dunes turn green in places.

10 ETOSHA NATIONAL PARK

Etosha is not Namibia's biggest national park, but it is most certainly its most famous. The park's most distinguishing feature is its enormous, silvery-white salt pan and the variety and concentration of game that gathers around its spring-fed waterholes. Nicknamed the "Place of Mirages", the terrain is a photographer's dream, especially when lion, wildebeest, or desert-adapted elephant appear through the haze against the stark backdrop. Etosha Pan, the remains of an ancient inland lake, covers about a quarter of the park with the rest of the park consisting of diverse habitats such as mopane woodland, treeless plains, and open savannah. Animals to look out for include desert-adapted elephant, blue wildebeest, eland, springbok, and gemsbok.





VOLCANOES NATIONAL PARK

Volcanoes National Park is part of the Virunga Massif that straddles three countries – Rwanda, the Democratic Republic of Congo, and Uganda. Together with Uganda's Mgahinga National Park and the Democratic Republic of Congo's Virunga National Park, Volcanoes National Park makes up a 44 800-hectare (110 000-acre) conservation area that is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and home to over 1,000 mountain gorillas. The Park was gazetted in 1925 to help protect these rare apes and is Africa's oldest national park. It is also considered the best place in East Africa to go gorilla trekking, thanks to its easy access to 12 habituated mountain gorilla groups. Aside from the gorillas, the park is also home to the endangered golden monkey.





NGORONGORO CRATER

Nearly 20 kilometres in diameter, the Ngorongoro Crater is the largest intact volcanic caldera in the world, and views from atop the 600 m high walls are spectacular. This nature wonderland offers sightings of the Big Five, a host of excellent plains game, and even the odd elusive leopard perched high in a tree. Flamingos can be seen wading through the central soda lake, and the freshwater lakes provide excellent bird watching. The area is protected as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and an estimated 25,000 large animals live in the crater. Olduvai Gorge is also archaeologically significant, with many important fossils and ancient tools discovered there.

SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

North

Sandwiched between the Central Serengeti and Kenya's Masai Mara National Reserve, the remote Northern Serengeti is the ideal destination for travellers wanting to experience the wilderness with few others around. Its landscape is defined by granite rock formations, grassy hills and acacia trees. In July and August (as well as October and November), the Great Migration sees large numbers of wildebeest and zebra cross the perilous waters of the Mara River. Because the area is not easily accessible, viewings of the river crossings are often less crowded. This region is also where you'll find most of the Serengeti's elephants, particularly in the Lobo Valley in the north-east. Look out for big cats, giraffe, hyenas, eland and hippos too.



10 TARANGIRE NATIONAL PARK

Located in northern Tanzania and named after the river that courses through it, Tarangire National Park is known for its large populations of elephant and abundance of baobab trees. 





LOWER ZAMBEZI NATIONAL PARK

The Lower Zambezi National Park is nestled in the south-east of Zambia, separated from Zimbabwe by the Zambezi River. It forms part of the greater Lower Zambezi system that spans Zambia, Zimbabwe, and Mozambique. The Park covers 4,092 square kilometers, but most of the game is concentrated along the valley floor. A much larger game management area surrounds it, and as there are no fences, animals are free to come and go. The Park is known for its enormous herds of elephants, which often congregate at the river's edge. "Island hopping" buffalo can usually be found grazing on the islands in the middle of the river, while the park's main predators, leopard, favour the park's many tall trees.



SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK

With the park covering 9,050 km2 of the Luangwa Valley floor and the Luangwa River meandering along its southern border, the park attracts large concentrations of wildlife including elephant, lion, leopard, African wild dog, buffalo, and the endemic Thornicroft's giraffe. 
KAFUE NATIONAL PARK

At 2.25 million hectares (5.5 million acres), Kafue National Park is one of the largest in Africa, and Zambia's oldest protected area. The northern sector is remote, wild and diverse, with vast tracts of pristine wilderness. The north-west is dominated by the Busanga Swamps, a wetland that gives way to the extensive floodplain of the Busanga Plains, seasonally inundated grassland dotted with isolated tree islands. The Lunga, Lufupa and Kafue rivers are lined with riverine forests, and the landscape is further patterned with broad-leaved miombo woodland, open plains, floodplains and island thickets. Lake Itezhi-Tezhi in the south is another prominent feature in Kafue.



HWANGE NATIONAL PARK

Hwange National Park, Zimbabwe's largest, sits on the border with Botswana. It's 1.4 million hectares (3.4 million acres) of Kalahari sands support a diversity of habitats, which, despite low rainfall, are a profusion of green in summer. Its location – a convergence zone between the Kalahari, moist miombo woodlands, and a broad band of mopane – ensures a captivating species diversity. Home to over 100 mammals and 400 recorded bird species, the park protects numerous species, and has one of Africa's densest concentrations of wildlife, particularly elephant and buffalo. While spectacularly productive in summer, the game viewing in the dry winter months (when the wildlife concentrates around the Park's numerous pans) is what makes Hwange world renowned.





5 LAKE KARIBA

In northern Zimbabwe, lies Lake Kariba. Situated between Zimbabwe and Zambia, it is the second-largest man-made lake in Africa and was formed when the Zambezi River was dammed at Kariba Gorge in the 1950s. MANA POOLS NATIONAL PARK

Mana Pools National Park, situated on the Zambezi River and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, offers spectacular views of the river, its floodplains, riverine woodland, and the mountains of Zambia's Rift Valley escarpment in the distance. Majestic ana trees line the river and its waters hold impressive concentrations of hippo, Nile crocodile, and healthy populations of tigerfish and bream. "Mana", meaning "four" in Shona, refers to the four main pools (Main, Chine, Long, and Chisambuk) – remnant ox-bow lakes from the Zambezi's past course – that, along with other inland pools, hold water year-round, attracting diverse wildlife including elephant, buffalo, zebra, various antelope, lion, leopard, and African wild dog.
