# Desert Rhino Camp

- Exclusive opportunity to track black rhino with monitors from Wilderness' on-site conservation partner, Save the Rhino Trust (SRT) Namibia. And learn about the unique survival skills of these extraordinary pachyderms in this harsh rocky desert environment.
- The area is home to other large mammals such as desert-adapted elephants, zebras, spotted hyenas and giraffes, and antelope such as oryx and springbok. Lions and leopards are also seen occasionally.
- Birdlife is prolific and diverse, with most of Namibia's endemics present. Key species include Rüppell's korhaan, Benguela long-billed lark, Herero chat and Verreaux's eagle.

Our pioneering partnership with the local community and the SRT ensures the ongoing conservation of one of the last free-roaming populations of black rhino on the planet.



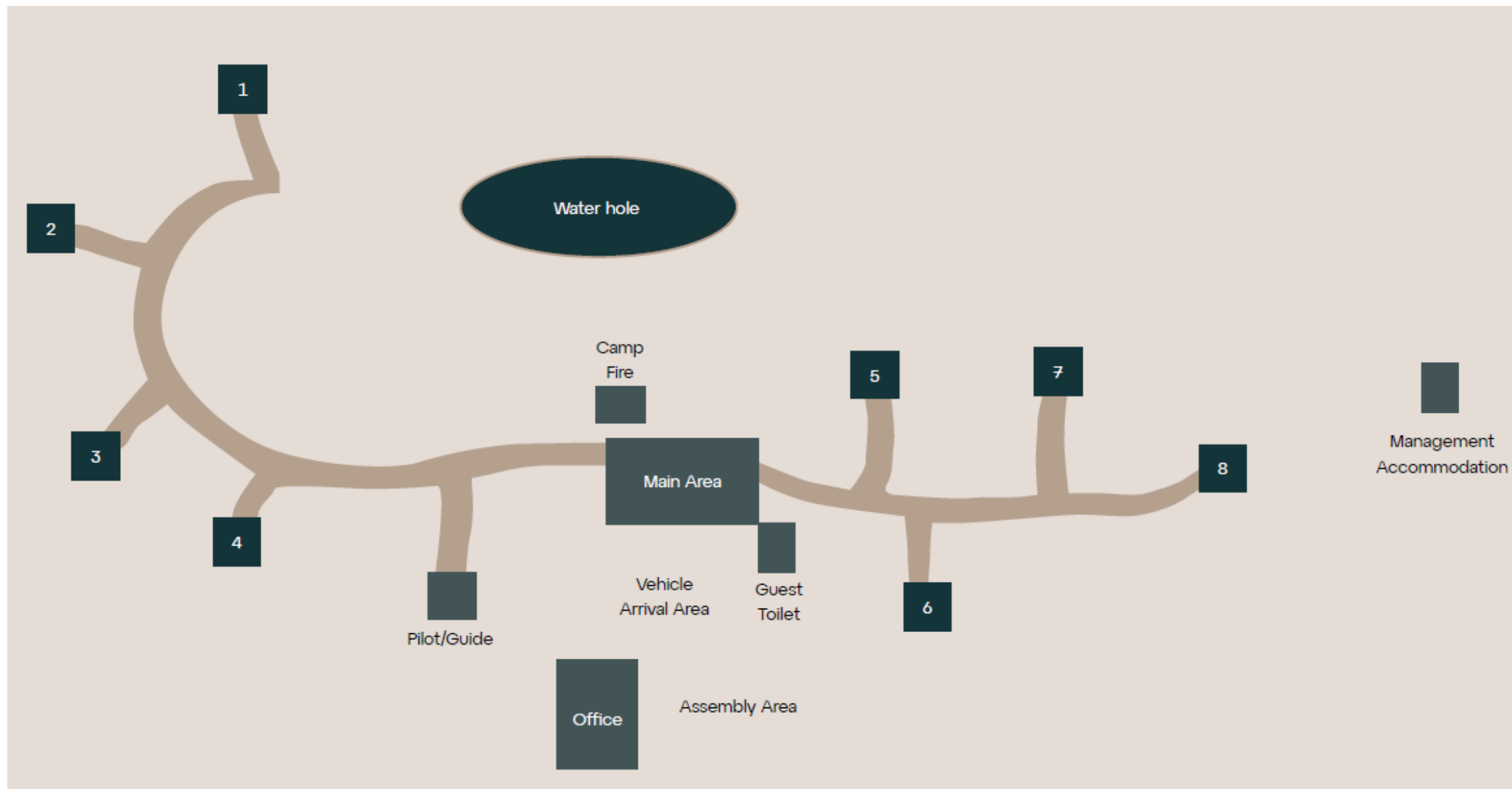

# Explore the desert

- Re-imagined Desert Rhino Camp will encourage a strong connection to the landscape, cocooned in the comfort of each tasteful new suite.
- Natural stone found on site inspires colour and texture and reinforces connection to the landscape.
- Large stretch-fabric roof structures with deep overhangs and silhouettes provide shade and protection without compromising the horizon-wide views.
- With details of timber and leather, the tent interiors, though modern, are noticeably inspired by the explorer genre.
