

Little Kulala

- Bordering the Namib-Naukluft National Park, which is accessible through an exclusive-use gate, Little Kulala is the closest luxury camp to the iconic red dunes of Sossusvlei and Dead Vlei.
- Thrilling hot air balloon flights over the vast Namib Sand Sea and mystical fairy circles are launched from our private reserve.
- The private Kulala Wilderness Reserve offers 27,000 hectares of endless spectacular desert scenery and extraordinary, and unexpected, desert wildlife.
- Adventures exclusive to Wilderness guests within the private reserve
 include guided nature drives, quad biking and electric fatbike excursions, and
 nature and running trails by day. By night, walks reveal fascinating nocturnal
 activity, while the spectacular night skies offer the best in star gazing.



Restoring the Wilderness

Once farmland used for subsistence goat farming, the Kulala Wilderness Reserve had very little indigenous wildlife. In 1996 Wilderness stepped in to rehabilitate the area and today the land and its wildlife have returned to their former glorious natural state.



Embracing Namib vistas

- Little Kulala is a living desert retreat in the heart of Sossusvlei. Peace and privacy can be found in all its spaces, including the Kulala Spa.
- Each large climate-controlled suite has a rooftop which can be used for starlit dinners or star gazing, and the spacious sala below has a private plunge pool and an area for outdoor siestas during the day, or sleep-outs under the stars.
