CAMPS TO COMBINE WITH

Start your Namibia journey with three nights at Little Kulala exploring the Kulala Wildlife Reserve on electric fatbikes and on foot, visit Sossusvlei and Deadvlei, and float silently over the Nanib Desert in a hot-air balloon.

Bedore arriving at Serra Cafema stop over at either Desert Rhino Camp to track desert-adapted black rhino or at Hoanib Skeleton Coast Camp with a day visit to the Skeleton Coast and exploring the Hoanib riverbed.

BEST TIME TO VISIT

December to March

- With good rains, a tapestry of grassland.
- Arid-adapted species are easily seen.
- Higher water levels of the Kunene River increase opportunity of boat trips

April to May

• Calm, comfortable days and pleasant evenings.

June to November

- Game species such as desert-adapted elephants and lion, giraffes and kudu tend to concentrate along these river systems and natural springs.
- Towards November, moisture in the air from the coastal fog results in trees slowly turning green

- One of the most extraordinarily remote places on Earth.
- Forming the border with Angola, the Kunene River carves its way to the Atlantic through dramatic rocky landscapes.
- Diverse wildlife from desert-adapted antelope to crocodiles and desert chameleons.
- Meet a Himba community Namibia's last semi-nomads and discover their ancient way of life.

Wilderness Serra Cafema is one of the most remote camps in Southern Africa, set under verdant trees on the banks of the Kunene River, looking across to Angola. Here guests can truly disconnect, unwind and relax to the sound of rushing water, and explore the seemingly endless horizon of the Namib Desert.
