Magashi Peninsula

- In a class of its own, Magashi Peninsula offers guests a uniquely high-end safari in Akagera National Park, and when paired with Rwanda's gorilla trekking at Bisate Reserve, creates a truly unparalleled, luxury in-country East African journey.
- Situated in a private concession within the national park, Magashi Peninsula overlooks the shimmering waters of Lake Rwanyakazinga and the Mutumba Mountains to the west, raised off the ground on low-level decks to further enhance the view.
- Magashi Peninsula's Villa (sleeps 4, but can further accommodate 2 children in the family room) offers an exclusive safari experience, complete with privately guided vehicle and boat excursions, as well as curated meals.
- Exceptional big game-viewing opportunities for leopard, lion, white rhinos, eastern black rhinos, buffalo, Masai giraffe, zebra, alongside 520 bird species.

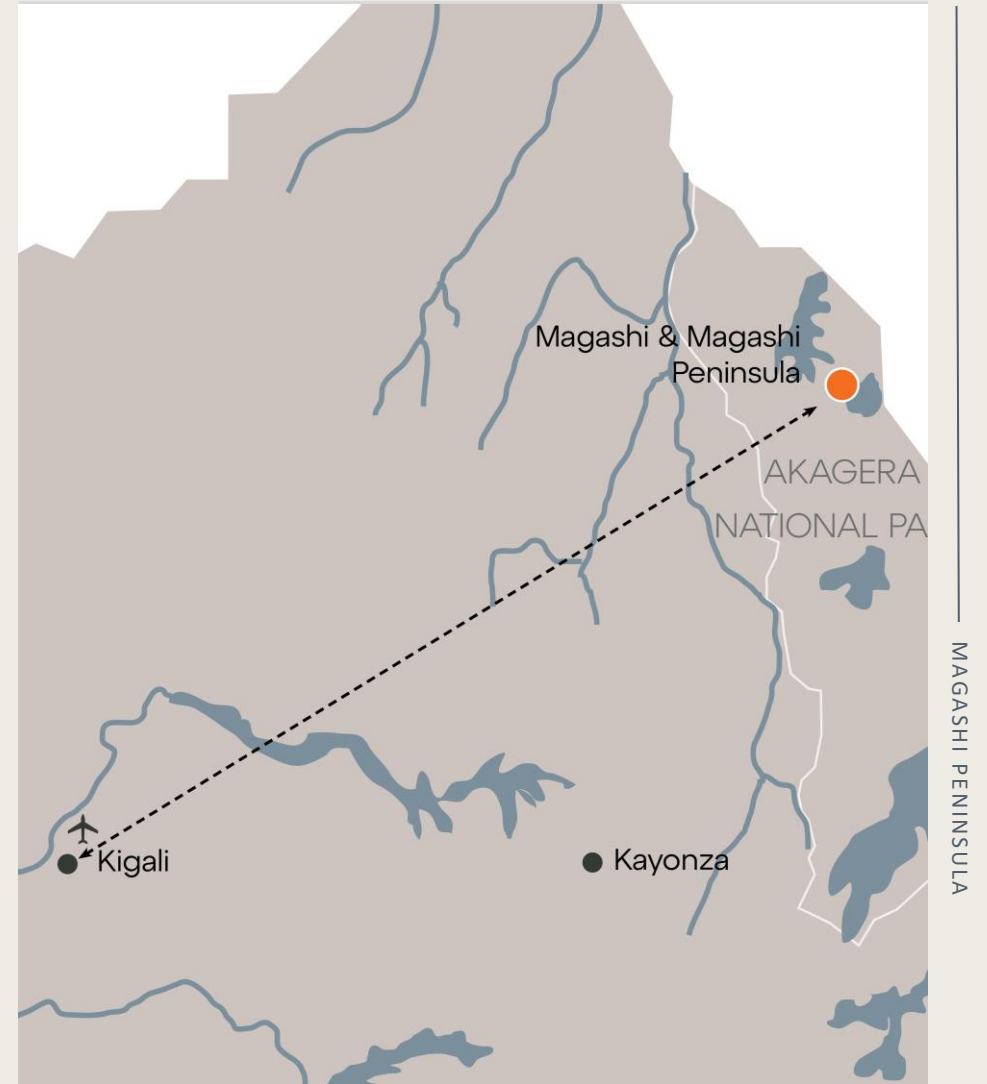

Access to Magashi Peninsula

- By Road: Approximately 3 hours from Kigali by vehicle transfer to Akagera National Park, followed by an hour's game drive within the park to Magashi Peninsula.
- By Air: 25-minute helicopter transfer from Kigali to Magashi Helipad, followed by a 10-minute drive to Magashi Peninsula.

Impact at Magashi Peninsula

Wilderness Magashi Peninsula embodies a purpose-driven ethos, combining luxury tourism with impactful conservation and community initiatives.

Three Rwandan guides from sister camp Magashi are the first to obtain FGASA qualifications in the country, with one also being the first female guide to achieve this milestone – reflecting Wilderness’ commitment to skills development.



ACCOMMODATION

Rwandan Inspired Luxury

- Elevated for sweeping views, accommodations include 2 spacious twin suites and a sole-use 4-bed private Villa.
- Raised off the ground to enhance the view, the camp overlooks Lake Rwanyakazinga and the Mutumba Mountains.
- Inspired by Rwandan culture, the interiors incorporate locally sourced materials and design elements.
- Thoughtful layout ensures privacy, with rooms spaced generously apart to create a sense of remoteness.
