ABOUT THE AREA

Remote and intimate, Wilderness Busanga Bush Camp is set on a lush tree island in Kafue’s famed Busanga Plains, one of Earth’s last truly wild places. Zambia’s oldest park spans 2.25 million hectares (5.5 million acres), with 600 km² (231 sq miles) of seasonally flooded plains to explore. Guests enjoy thrilling game drives and boat trips, spotting hippos and abundant birdlife in this pristine wilderness.

CAMPS TO COMBINE WITH

- Davison’s Camp

ACCESS TO CAMP

- **Airstrip name:** Plains Airstrip
- **June to July:** Approximately 20-minute vehicle transfer in a game viewer from the airstrip to the mokoro pick-up point, followed by a 20-minute or so mokoro trip to a game viewer, and then a roughly 10-minute drive into camp
- **August to November:** Approximately 40-minute vehicle transfer from the airstrip to the camp

HIGHLIGHTS

- Open for just five months a year, this truly remote camp delivers the ultimate wildlife safari.
- Epic exchanges between the famous lions of the area reveal interesting pride dynamics.
- The exceptional biodiversity of the Busanga Plains draws plains game – oribi, roan and sable, just a few of the specials – and plenty predators.

BEST TIME TO TRAVEL

Busanga Bush Camp is open from 01 June to 31 October.

May to June

- Moderate climate with pleasant days.
- A mix of the green and dry conditions, including the dynamics of a change in season.

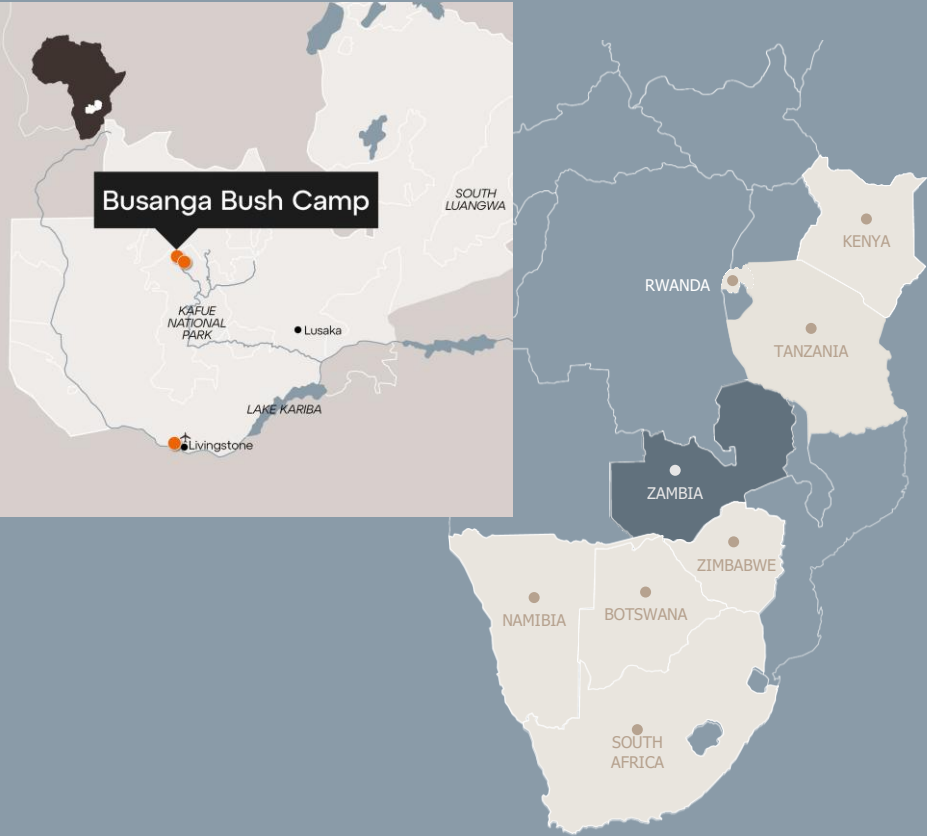
July to October

- Drying water sources means high game concentrations on the Busanga Plains, particularly in the second half of this period.
- Cool and dry, with temperatures gradually rising toward October
