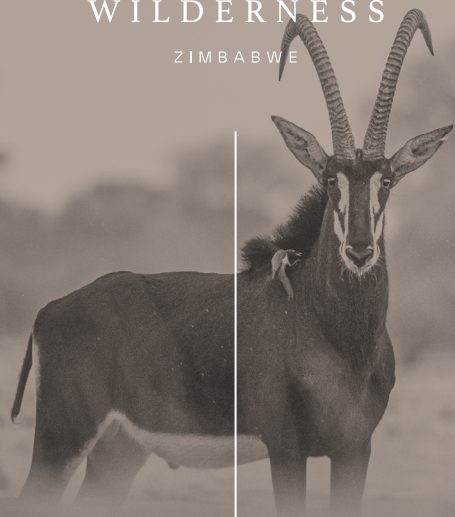
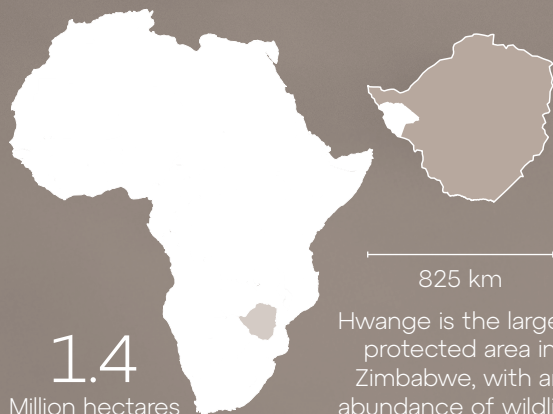

the annual Hwange Game Count
indicate that significant numbers of
the Park's wildlife are found in our
concessions during the dry season.

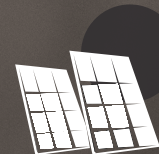
