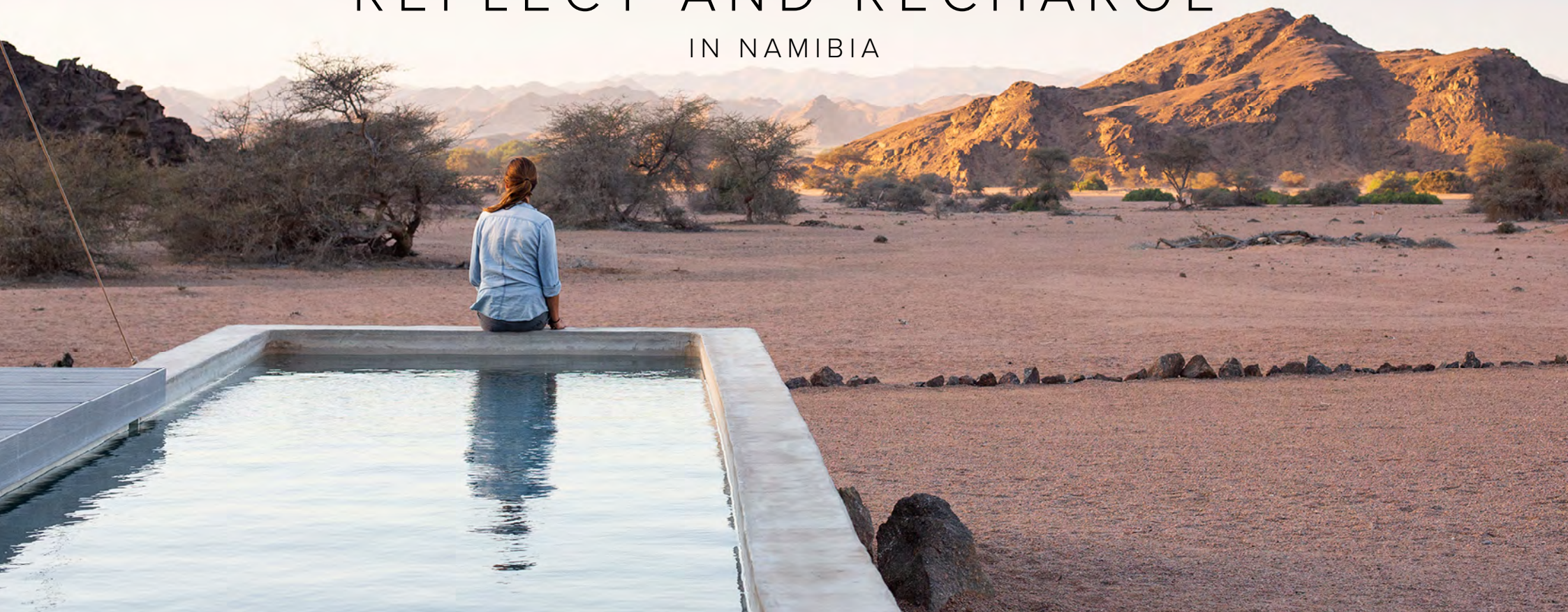

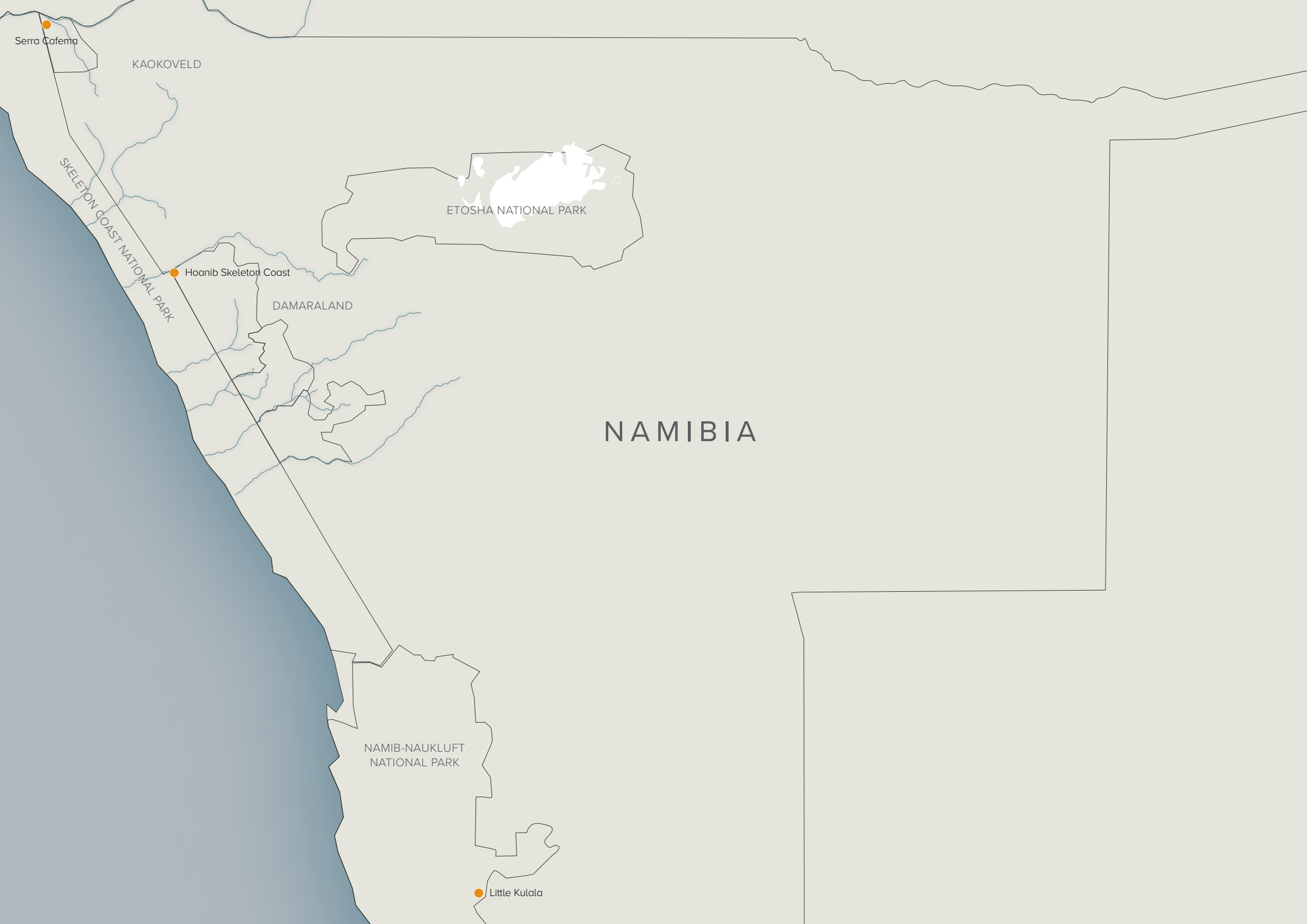

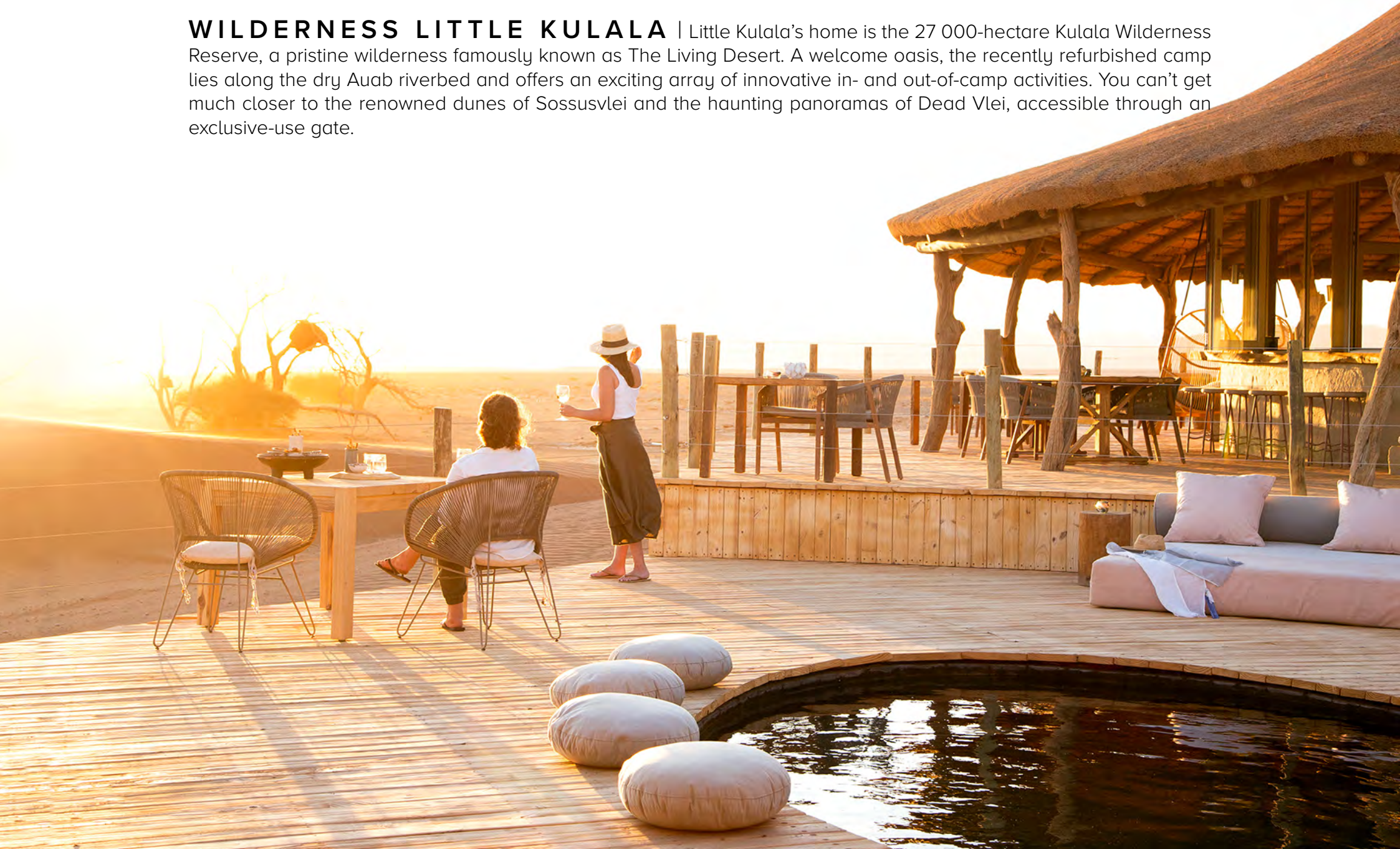

**WILDERNESS LITTLE KULALA** | Little Kulala's home is the 27 000-hectare Kulala Wilderness Reserve, a pristine wilderness famously known as The Living Desert. A welcome oasis, the recently refurbished camp lies along the dry Auab riverbed and offers an exciting array of innovative in- and out-of-camp activities. You can't get much closer to the renowned dunes of Sossusvlei and the haunting panoramas of Dead Vlei, accessible through an exclusive-use gate.





**WILDERNESS SERRA CAFEMA** | Tune in, or tune out – in one of the most untouched places on Earth, along a mesmerising river carving through the ancient Namib Desert. Respectfully engage with a community of Himba, our partners in the camp and Namibia’s last semi-nomads still living traditionally, the local custodians. Hear their stories, and share yours.





**WILDERNESS HOANIB SKELETON COAST CAMP** | Stylish Hoanib Skeleton Coast Camp rests in Namibia's famed Kaokoveld, a remarkable landscape hewn over the ages into immense dunes and craggy mountains. Explore rust-coloured outcrops and arid plains in search of desert-adapted wildlife, with elephant, lion, hyaena, giraffe and oryx among the regular sightings. Visit the Hoanib Research Centre, supported by Wilderness, and learn more about the fascinating Skeleton Coast Brown Hyaena Project led by researcher Emsie Verwey.
