But life there is, and in many diverse and unique forms ... from the Himba people, one of the last true nomadic tribes on Earth, to the distinctive desert-adapted elephant, the bizarre welwitschia plant and the superbly-adapted tenebrionid beetles.

- Relevant park fees and entrance fees as specified in the quote;
- Drinks as specified – drink inclusions may differ between camps/lodges;
- Laundry can be done at most camps/lodges and hotels. In some cases this is included in the rate as quoted;

- Air transfers as specified, including Departure Taxes as relevant on Wilderness Air in Botswana and Namibia;
- Accommodation taxes, the applicable Tourism Levies and all relevant Value Added Tax (VAT) or Government Sales Tax (GST).

EXCLUSIONS:

- Meals not specified in the quote such as lunch and dinner in city hotels;
- Any drinks, park fees, entrance fees, portage, tours/excursions and transfers not specified in the quote;
- Any scheduled commercial flights and related taxes;
- Cancellation, baggage and medical insurance;
- Staff gratuities;
- Any new Government Taxes, levies, fuel or industry increases which are beyond our control;

- Visa fees where relevant. Should a visa payment be required, this will need to be made in US Dollar cash. Change is often not provided and thus the exact amounts payable are essential (with small denominations encouraged for easier and quicker transactions). Travellers Cheques and credit cards are not usually accepted for this purpose;
- Departure Taxes are excluded on all light aircraft transfers in Zambia and Zimbabwe. Applicable at manned airports only, these taxes are to be paid direct in cash on departure, unless included in your air ticket cost;
- All taxes are subject to change without prior notice;
- Zambia Airport Departure Taxes: may be paid in US Dollars or Kwacha, the local currency. Kwacha amounts may vary depending on the rate of exchange on the day – the below are guidelines only. Note that credit cards and Travellers Cheques are not accepted forms of payment for this purpose.
- On International flights: Departure tax, security tax and infrastructure & development tax - US\$40.00 per person; Passenger Safety Charge - US\$ 10.00 per person
- On Domestic flights: Departure tax, security tax and infrastructure & development tax - US\$16.00 per person; Passenger Safety Charge - US\$ 5.00 per person
- Zimbabwe Airport Departure Taxes: paid in US Dollars only and in cash. Currently, and subject to change, these taxes are as follows:
 - On International flights: Departure Tax plus Aviation Infrastructural Development Fund – US\$ 50.00 per person.
 - On Domestic flights: Departure Tax plus Aviation Infrastructural Development Fund – US\$ 15.00 per person.
 - Ex Kariba Airport specifically: Departure Tax – US\$ 15.00 per person.

DAY 1 & 2 DESERT RHINO CAMP

Set in a remote valley of the Palmwag Concession, this light-footprint camp is the result of a forward-thinking rhino conservation partnership between ourselves, Save the Rhino Trust (SRT) and the Namibian government. Privileged access to desert-adapted black rhino from this special location is enabled by skilled SRT trackers. The red-rock-strewn valleys, interspersed with tiny springs, are home to numbers of Hartmann's mountain zebra, giraffe, oryx, springbok and spotted hyaena too.

DAY 3 & 4: SERRA CAFEMA



The most remote camp in Namibia – and perhaps the whole of southern Africa – Serra Cafema is unique. The stylish and comfortable lodge (rebuilt in 2018) is perched on the edge of the permanently-flowing Kunene River – an anomaly in the desert – and is a cool, calm refuge from the aridity of daily expeditions by vehicle or quad bike to visit traditional Himba communities or explore the scenic drama of the endless Hartmann's Valley.

DAY 5 & 7: HOANIB SKELETON COAST CAMP

In a broad, dry valley that looks toward the seldom-flowing Hoanib River lies Hoanib Skeleton Coast Camp. In this land of rugged mountains, gravel plains and rolling dunefields, regular encounters with a surprising array of large, charismatic desert-adapted wildlife abound, from elephant, lion and giraffe to oryx, springbok and even brown hyaena. The camp's position allows access to the legendary Skeleton Coast, with its stark shores and seal colonies, along with views of secret oases, magnificent dunes and unexpected yet thriving life.
