BOTSWANA

Botswana offers perhaps the best wildlife experience on the planet – thanks to its contrasting areas and large concentrations of diverse wildlife throughout.

The miraculous Okavango Delta – in which lies the celebrated Moremi Game Reserve – with its network of channels, islands and lagoons, is complemented by the elephant corridor of northern Botswana's private Linyanti Wildlife Reserve, a part of the Chobe ecosystem. The Central Kalahari Game Reserve, with its arid scenery, delivers one of the most remarkable desert experiences on the planet.

THINGS TO LOOK FORWARD TO IN BOTSWANA:

- The profusion of wildlife, including predators such as lion, leopard, cheetah, hyaena and wild dog
- Exploring the blue-green Okavango Delta by mokoro (traditional canoe) or boat
- Huge herds of elephants in the Linyanti
- Walking ancient paths through the desert with a San guide
- Flying between our camps and witnessing the truly unique and pristine ecosystem below

NAMIBIA

As one of the driest areas on the planet with an infinite supply of blue skies, sun-drenched weather and star-filled nights, Namibia is the ultimate escape into the wilderness.

From our camps you can explore the soaring red dunes of Sossusvlei, the isolated and dramatic coastline of the Atlantic Ocean, the ancient valleys and fascinating geological wonders of Damaraland and the extraordinarily remote and mystical Kunene – and the unique desert-adapted wildlife dotted throughout.

THINGS TO LOOK FORWARD TO IN NAMIBIA:

- Climbing the world's tallest sand dunes at Sossusvlei
- Exploring the Skeleton Coast with its Cape fur seal colonies and shipwreck remains
- Tracking black rhino on foot in true wilderness
- Appreciating one of the oldest rock art sites in the world – Twyfelfontein
- Respectful interactions with our community partners – the Himba and Riemvasmaker people

RWANDA

Situated at the heart of the Albertine Rift, Rwanda is one of Africa's most biodiverse regions and a haven of rainforest endemism. The undulating hills and mountains of the rainforest on the western peaks give way to wetland and savannah in the east.

Rwanda's most celebrated wild mammal is the magnificent mountain gorilla found in the Virunga Massif, amongst a host of other rainforest species. Less known yet equally fascinating is the sweeping scenery and thriving wildlife of Akagera National Park, where the likes of lion, leopard and buffalo roam.

THINGS TO LOOK FORWARD TO IN RWANDA:

- Tracking mountain gorillas and other primates in the natural splendour of untouched rainforest
- Visiting the poignant Kigali Genocide Memorial
- Interacting with the warm, friendly people and learning about their culture
- Learning about the reforestation and chimp habituation programmes at Gishwati
- Exploring the Rwandan savannah with its wealth of big game

ZAMBIA

Zambia is a vast country, friendly and peaceful, that offers a timeless sense of undiscovered wilderness, sharing the magic of the Zambezi River and Victoria Falls with neighbouring Zimbabwe.

When it comes to wildlife, Zambia offers impressive diversity as well as large concentrations, and some of the wildest and most remote game areas on the continent. Busanga Plains in the Kafue National Park is the best of these, and a place where lion and unusual antelope dominate.

THINGS TO LOOK FORWARD TO IN ZAMBIA:

- Catching sight of the famous channel-leaping lions of the Kafue
- Taking in the astonishing remoteness of the plains – and wildlife – from a hot air balloon
- Boating on the mighty Zambezi looking for hippo, crocodile and colourful birds
- Learning about Zambian culture and interacting with the local people
- Enjoying thrilling adrenaline adventures around Victoria Falls

ZIMBABWE

Cradled by the mighty Zambezi – that flows over the world-famous Victoria Falls – and the Limpopo rivers, Zimbabwe is a land of beautiful vistas and amazing wildlife.

Our scenic and private areas include Hwange, where our waterholes attract massive herds of elephant, buffalo and plains game – followed by their predators; and photogenic Mana Pools, where the fast-flowing Zambezi attracts a myriad wildlife.

THINGS TO LOOK FORWARD TO IN ZIMBABWE:

- Watching enormous herds of elephant gathering at Hwange's numerous waterholes
- Cruising down the Zambezi River by boat or, for the more adventurous, by canoe
- Game driving through classic safari country in scenic and wildlife-rich national parks
- Experiencing the thrill of sleeping out in a remote Star Bed
- Bungee jumping, or gorge swinging, at the breathtaking Victoria Falls
