Pulpose

With Chikwenya, we continue to demonstrate our unwavering commitment to driving authentic and sustainable ecotourism in Zimbabwe.

As a private-access area neighbouring Mana Pools National Park, Chikwenya joins the Park in playing an important role in protecting what is considered to be one of the great wildlife spectacles on the continent and in preserving a feel of real wilderness — a function that is recognised in its World Heritage Site status.

We have also partnered with Painted Dog Conservation to make a difference to the African wild dog population in Zimbabwe. Through this, we aim to gain insight into the demography, ecology and genetic composition of the Middle Zambezi wild dog population.










Cocation

Mana Pools National Park (219 600 hectares / 542 643 acres) lies at the heart of the Zambezi Valley, where the Zambezi River meanders to the Mozambican border. It is a remote, beautiful place with spectacular views of the broad river, floodplains, riverine woodland and the mountains of the Rift Valley escarpment. This stretch of the Zambezi River is famous for its four main pools (after which the Park is named: 'mana' means 'four' in Shona) – Main, Chine, Long and Chisambuk – which are remnants of channels of the river which stopped flowing years ago. These and smaller seasonal pools dotted further inland hold water all year round, drawing all manner of wildlife and waterfowl during the dry season. The ana trees that characterise the floodplain shed their protein-rich pods during this time, providing vital sustenance for many species, particularly elephant.


TIME OF YEAR

Chikwenya is open seasonally between 01 April and 30 November.





Large concentrations of buffalo and elephant can be found along the river's edges, while predators such as lion, wild dog and leopard are often sighted. Kudu, zebra, impala and waterbuck feed on the surrounding plains, eland roam the concession and the grunting of hippo can be heard all day.

Birdlife is superb, particularly for woodland and riverine species, with numerous local specials such as black-throated wattle-eye, red-necked falcon, Livingstone's flycatcher, racket-tailed roller, three-banded courser, Böhm's spinetail, mosque swallow, western banded snake-eagle, crested guineafowl, trumpeter hornbill and eastern nicator — to mention a few.
