

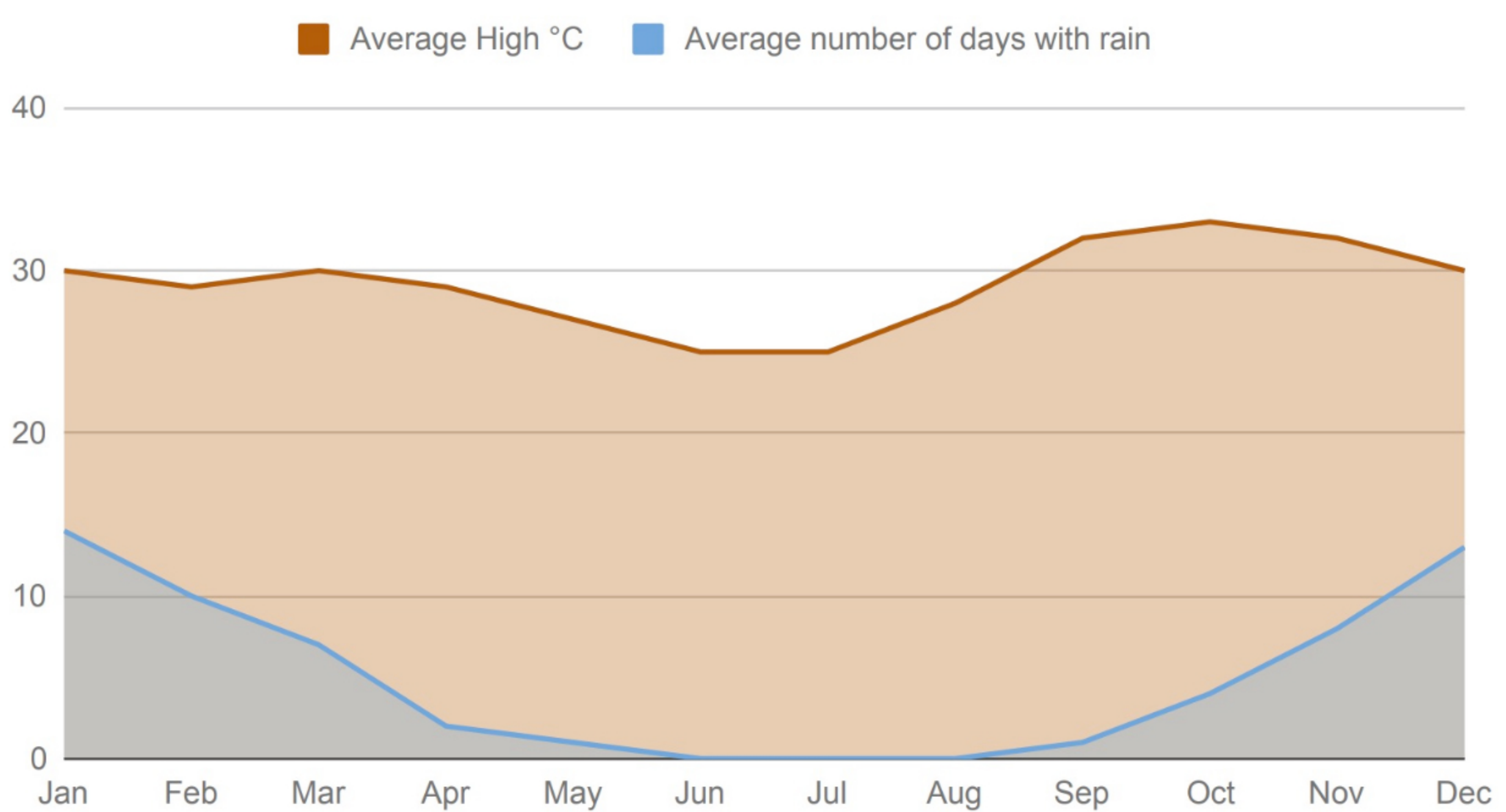


Zimbabwe through the Year.

Zimbabwe enjoys lovely, temperate weather with winter and summer in opposite times to the Northern hemisphere.

The rainy season is from about November through to March. Rains usually fall in heavy afternoon showers with plenty of sunshine still to be found, although rarely rain settles in for a few days. From April to August expect pleasant dry, sunny days with cool nights. In September the temperature rises and September and October are generally dry and hot with great safari sightings as animals are forced to congregate around water sources.

Open Year Round

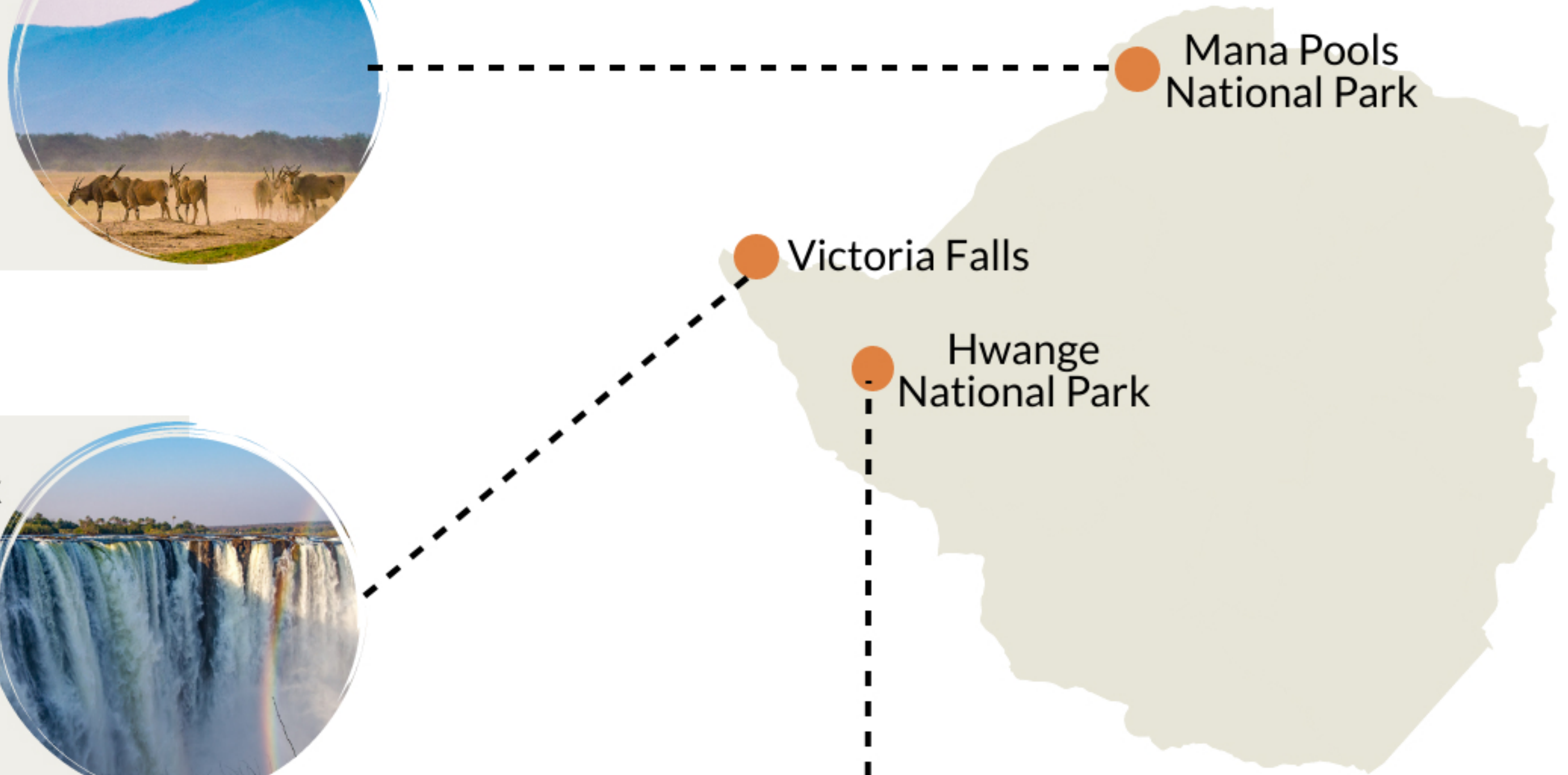
High Water Feb-April

Water levels at Victoria Falls vary tremendously throughout the year as the Zambezi is fed by rain water from upstream. Flood waters arrive in about February and peak in April with high water resulting in clouds of spray and sometimes poor visibility on the ground. This is a great time to see the Falls from the air. From October to January water levels are low making visibility good, although the Falls can appear less impressive now, white water rafting is at its best. Viewing is best overall from May though to September.
